

Boy Toys Quilt

Designed by Marinda Stewart

Finished quilt approximately 45 ½" w x 42" h

Materials Needed

5/8 yard **C2008 Transportation** – col. Retro

(must have 2 complete rows of large motifs)

½ yard **C323 Stripe** –col. Retro

½ yard **C1400 Spotlight** – col. Retro

3/8 yard **C1338 Party Dot** – col. Retro

¼ yard **JET Black**

6"x6" piece **C1338 Party Dot** – col. Yellow

Backing 46" x 50"

Batting 46" x 50"

Thread to match

Scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, mat, rotary cutter

Directions

1. From C2008 cut out 10 motifs. Leave ¼" black margin around each motif. Note: 1 motif will be left over.
2. From C323 cut (2) 2 ½" wide strips. For row #1, sew an 8 ¼" length to the right of motif #1. Sew second motif to stripe. Add another length of C323 to motif #2. Sew motif #3 to remaining edge of stripe. Make two more rows in the same manner using the remaining motifs. Refer to photo for placement of the motifs in each row.
3. For sashing between rows, from 6"x6" piece of C1338 Yellow, cut four 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares. From C323 strips cut three pieces 9 ¼"x 2 ½" each. Piece together with C1338 between each strip. Make two rows of sashing.
4. To join rows, sew one row of sashing to bottom of row #1. Join row #2 to bottom of sashing. Add remaining sashing to bottom of row #2. Add row #3 to bottom of sashing. Center of quilt is complete.

5. For border #1, from C1400 cut four strips each 4" wide. Sew one strip to both the top and bottom of the quilt and one strip to each side of the quilt.
6. For border #2, from C323 cut four 3" wide strips. Sew to the quilt as in step #5.
7. For border #3, from C1338 Retro, cut four 3 ½" wide strips. Attach to quilt as in step #5.
8. Layer backing, batting and quilt top. Baste. Quilt as desired.
9. For binding, from JET Black, cut five 1 ¾" wide strips. Piece as needed. Sew to top and bottom and each side of quilt. Turn under ¼" seam. Fold binding to back of quilt. Stitch in place.

DISCLAIMERS

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2. Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.
3. While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions, this does not allow for personal variations in measuring, cutting and/or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.
