

Buried Treasure

Quilt designed by Marinda Stewart. Quilt measures approximately 50" x 50"

Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
CX3279 Blue*	2-7/8 yards	Cut two horizontal pieces 36-1/2" x 7-1/2". Cut two vertical pieces 7-1/2" x 50-1/2". See Appliqué instructions for one pirate ship and one rowboat with flag.
CX1065 Navy	5/8 yard	Cut twenty-six 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips. Cut five 2-1/4" x width of fabric strips. Piece the strips together for the binding. Place fusible web on the back of the remaining piece of fabric, cut twenty-six ovals, using the oval template.
CX3060 Sand	3/8 yard	Cut one 11" x 24-1/2" piece.
CX2517 Blue	3/8 yard	Cut one 11-1/2" x 24-1/2" piece.
CX1065 Red	1/4 yard	Cut (104) 1-1/2" squares.
CX2857 Cherry	1/4 yard	Cut (104) 1-1/2" squares.
K1164	1/4 yard	Cut one 6" x 24-1/2" square.
CX2860 Sky	1/4 yard	Cut twenty-six pieces 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips. Place fusible web on the back of the remaining piece of fabric, cut twenty-six ovals, using the oval template.
CX0940 Red	1/4 yard	Cut two 1-1/2" x 24-1/2" strips. Cut two 1-1/2" x 26-1/2" strips.
CX0323 Primary	1/4 yard	Cut two 1-1/2" x 34-1/2" strips. Cut two 1-1/2" x 36-1/2" strips.
CX3060 Moss	Fat Eighth	See Appliqué instructions to make seven palm fronds.
CX1753 Brown	12" x 20"	See Appliqué instructions to make the Treasure Chest and Chest Pocket.
CX3184 Black	4" x 18"	See Appliqué instructions to make two palm tree trunks.
K1156	9" x 14"	See Appliqué instructions to make four palm fronds.
Jet Black	10" x 10"	Cut four 4-1/2" squares.
CG0376 Glow	9" x 9"	See Appliqué instructions to make four skull and cross-bones.
CX3100 Cinnamon	6" x 8"	See Appliqué instructions to make the two Treasure Chest linings.
CX0274 Yellow	5" x 7"	See Appliqué instructions to make fifteen sun rays.
CX2858 Sunny	4" x 4"	See Appliqué instructions to make the sun.
CM0376 Gold	3" x 3"	See Appliqué instructions to make the brass fittings for the Treasure Chest.

*This is a one-way print. Excess fabric can be pieced into the quilt backing.

55" x 55" backing
55" x 55" batting
Fusible Web
Threads to Match
Scissors, Straight Pins
Acrylic Ruler, Mat, Rotary Cutter
Basic Sewing Supplies
Black Fabric Pen

You will also need (continued):

Assorted Treasures: buttons, beads, trims, broken jewelry, flat-backed jewels, secret message/treasure map
Threads to match
Scissors, straight pins, hand-sewing needle, acrylic ruler, mat, rotary cutter
Six 3/4 round wood buttons for coconuts

Optional:

Jewel glue for flat-backed jewels
Permanent fabric marking pen (medium tip)

- Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.
- While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions, this does not allow for personal variations in measuring, cutting and or sewing. the enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

Assembly Instructions

- Sew together one 11-1/2" x 24-1/2" CX2517 piece to one 6" x 24-1/2" K1164 piece along the long edge to make the quilt top.
- To create the irregular sand horizon, place the 11" x 24-1/2" CX3060 strip on top of the K1164 raw edge, of the quilt top, right sides up on both fabrics. Overlap approximately 1". With a rotary cutter, free-hand cut a gentle serpentine line. Sew the CX3060 strip to the K1164, easing curves to make a 24-1/2" x 24-1/2" piece.
- Sew the 1-1/2" x 24-1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. Sew the 1-1/2" x 26-1/2" strips to the sides of the quilt.
- To make a pieced Unit One, place one 1-1/2" CX1065-red square in a corner of one 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" CX2860 rectangle. Sew diagonally from inside corner to the outside corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim the excess fabric from the back leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Repeat for remaining three corners. Repeat for all CX2860 rectangles and CX1065-red squares to make twenty-six units. Place the CX1065-navy ovals in the center of each CX2860 rectangle. Machine appliqué around the edges of the oval to finish each Unit One.
- To make a pieced Unit Two, place one 1-1/2" CX2857 square in a corner of one 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" CX1065-navy rectangle. Sew diagonally from inside corner to the outside corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim the excess fabric from the back leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Repeat for remaining three corners. Repeat for all CX1065-navy rectangles and CX2857 squares to make twenty-six units. Place the CX2860 ovals in the center of each CX-1065-navy rectangle. Machine appliqué around the oval's raw edge and to finish each Unit Two.
- Sew thirteen units together, alternating between the CX2860 rectangles and the CX1065-navy rectangles. Make four rows. Sew one row to the top and one row to the bottom of the quilt.
- Trace the skull and crossed bones onto the paper side of the fusible web. Iron to the wrong side of CG0376. Cut out the pieces. Fuse to the center of each Jet Black piece. Machine appliqué around all the raw edges. Using the fabric pencil, draw the nostrils and teeth as shown in the picture.
- Sew one square to the top and bottom of each remaining pieced row. Keep the motifs upright. Sew one row to each side of the quilt.
- Sew one CX0323 1-1/2" x 34-1/2" strip to the top and bottom of the quilt. Sew one CX0323 1-1/2" x 36-1/2" pieces to each side of the quilt.
- Sew one CX3279 36-1/2" x 7 1/2" strip to the top and bottom of the quilt. Sew one

7-1/2" X 50-1/2" piece to each side of the quilt. (Remaining fabric can be pieced into the quilt backing.)

Fusible Applique Instructions

Note: Refer to the quilt photo for appliqué placement.

- 11) Following manufacturer's directions, trace each listed template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each shape, leaving about 1/4" around each drawn shape.
- 12) Press each fusible shape to the backside of the listed fabric. Cut out each shape on the drawn line.
- 13) For the sun, place the "sun" and "sunrays" in the upper right corner of the quilt top as shown in the picture. Fuse in place. Machine appliqué around the raw edges to finish.
- 14) Free-hand cut two palm tree trunks wider at the bottom and narrower at the top from CX3184. Iron in place as shown on the picture. Arrange the seven CX3060 fronds and the four K1156 fronds as shown. Fuse in place. Machine appliqué to finish all raw edges. Make sure to overlap palm fronds onto the pieced borders as shown.
- 15) For the Treasure Chest, reverse the images and trace all the "brass" fittings onto the fusible web. Iron onto CM0376-gold. Do the same with the two Treasure Chest linings, using CX3100. For the Treasure Chest itself, use CX1753. Cut out all pieces. Fuse the linings onto the Treasure Chest lid and Chest. Add the "brass" corners, lock and hinges to the lid. Place the Treasure Chest and lid in the sand as shown. Fuse in place. Machine appliqué to finish.
- 16) For the Treasure Chest pocket, cut a right and a left facing piece from CX1753 Brown. With right sides together, stitch around all sides, pivoting at each corner. Leave a 1 1/2" opening on one side for turning. Trim all outside corners. Clip inside corners. Turn to the right side. Press slip stitch opening closed and sew. Attach remaining "brasses" to the pocket as shown. Machine appliqué all raw edges. Using a wide stitch, attach pocket to the chest on three sides. Using the fabric pen, draw on remaining details. Satin-stitch handles and lock openings as shown.
- 17) Rough cut the Pirate ship and rowboat/flag from CX3279 and back each with fusible web. Cut out each shape. Place ship on the horizon of the ocean as shown fuse in place. Place the rowboat on the edge of the sand as shown, fuse in place. Machine appliqué both pieces to finish.
- 18) Layer, quilt and bind as desired.
- 19) Sew three (3) wooden buttons in the top of each tree for coconuts.
- 20) Fill Treasure chest with beads, trinkets, buttons, as shown. Spill "treasures" out onto the sand as shown. Attach any flat-backed jewels with jewel glue.
- 21) Optional: Make your own treasure map or write a secret message and hide it inside the Treasure Chest pocket.
