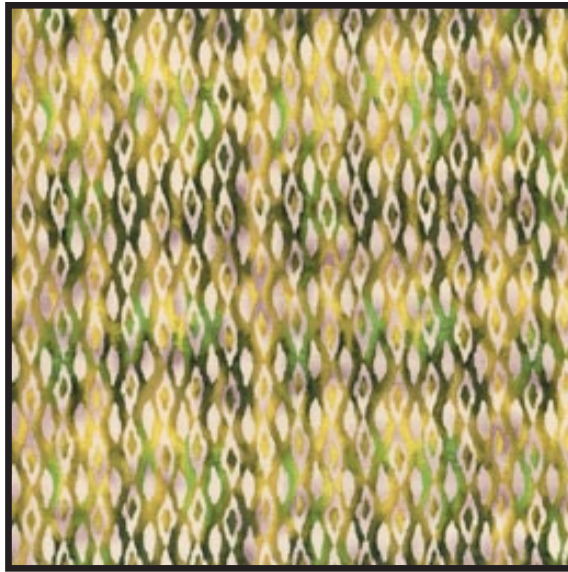

1 1/4 yards**

3/8 yard**

Backing 45" x 60" and Batting 45" x 60"

Materials

Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
CX6048 Lime Caravan	1 1/8 yards	(1) 38 1/2" H x 43 1/2" W
CX6041 Multi Silk Road Stripe	1 1/4 yards	(1) 12 1/2" x 38 1/2" * (102) 60 degree triangles as follows in sets of six** • (36) 1 1/2" tall • (6) 2 1/4" • (12) 2 1/2" • (24) 3" • (12) 4 1/2" • (12) 6 1/2" tall
CX6048 Black Caravan	3/8 yard	(5) 2 1/2" x W.O.F. - binding
* Center on border motif on one side of the fabric. ** Use a 60 degree triangle specialty ruler for cutting ease. Invert the triangle across striped areas to vary colors of each hexagon.		
Also Needed: 45" x 60" backing, 45" x 60" batting, thread to match, scissors, straight pins, rotary cutter, acrylic ruler, and mat. Optional but recommended: 60 degree triangle acrylic ruler and smoke clear nylon thread for topstitching.

Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.

While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements, and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting, and or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

Directions

1. For (1) hexagon - cut (6) 60 degree triangles from the same striped area of fabric. Sew together (2) sets of (3) triangles, then sew the two sets together to make one hexagon. Turn under 1/4" seam allowance on all sides. Pin to the CX6048 Lime 38 1/2" x 43 1/2" piece as shown or as desired. Topstitch in place. From the back cut away excess background fabric leaving approximately 1/4" seam allowance. To make the best use of all of the fabric place the triangle ruler right side up, then invert the ruler for the next triangle. Cut (6) in each direction for one complete hexagon. The two hexagons will be opposite of each other - giving a different look. Make (2) hexagons using 6 1/2" tall triangles. 4 1/2" tall, (4) 3" tall, (2) 2 1/2" tall, (1) 2 1/4" tall, and (6) 1 1/2" tall. Make (17) assorted hexagons total. Scatter across the background as shown or as desired. Topstitch each in place. Clear smoke nylon thread was used for invisible stitching.
2. Sew CX6041 12 1/2" x 38 1/2" border to the bottom of the quilt.
3. Layer backing, batting, and quilt top. Baste.
4. Quilt as desired.
5. Bind quilt using CX6048 Black pieced as needed for length.
