## Materials



Also Needed:
$53^{\prime \prime} \times 66^{\prime \prime}$ backing, $53 \times 66^{\prime \prime}$ batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, rotary cutter, acrylic ruler.

Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.
While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements, and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting, and or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

## Directions

Use 1/4" seam allowance and press all seams open unless otherwise directed

1. For each star unit you will need a $4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ square and (4) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ pieces cut from one fabric. You will also need (4) 4 " $\times 4$ " background squares.
2. Stack (4) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares and slice in half diagonally so you have 8 triangles.

3. Select a background square and one of the star point triangles. Stitch the triangle to the background square right sides together. Changing the angle of the triangles will help create the wonky-ness of the star. The triangles need to be placed so that, after being sewn down and pressed open, they extend past the edges of the
 background fabric. This will keep your star unit pieces square and ensure that your quilt top come together.
4. Cut away excess and press.

5. Stitch another star point triangle to the opposite corner of the background piece. Again, make sure that the triangle will cover the background fabric when pressed open.
6. Trim and press.
7. Square up the finished star point unit to a 4 " $\times 4$ " square.

8. Repeat Steps 2-7 to make 3 more points units (for a total of 4).

Stack the finished points units together with their matching center square.
9. Repeat the steps for each of the 17 fabrics.
10. Use a design wall or open floor space to lay out your pieces. Fill in background squares where needed. Refer to the diagram for placement.
11. Sew blocks together in horizontal rows. Sew rows together to complete quilt top.
12. Layer backing, batting and quilt top. Baste.
13. Quilt as desired.
14. Join together binding strips end-to end following the color gradient. Bind.
