Materials

Cutting instructions

Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

	Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
(A)	CX7350-Haze Pretty Grid – Haze	1 yard	• Cut one 33 ½" square.
(B)	CX7348-Aqua Tweet Me – Aqua	1 ⅓ yards	 Cut two 5 ½" x 36 ½" LOF strips. Cut two 5 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips from the remaining fabric, piece as needed.
(C)	CX7351-Pink Bitty Blooms – Pink	½ yard	 Cut two 2" x 33 ½" WOF strips. Cut two 2" x 36 ½" WOF strips. Place a 5 ½" square piece of fusible web on the remaining fabric. Cut out the square and trim the piece to 4 ½" square.
(D)	CX7349-Pink Love Shack – Pink	⅓ yard	• Cut one 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into four 5 ½" squares.
(E)	CX7350-Purple Pretty Grid – Purple	⅓ yard	 See instructions to cut one roof for House #4. See instructions to cut six tulips. Place a 10" square of fusible web on the wrong side of the remaining fabric. Cut out a 6 x 9" strip with the fusible web.
(F)	CX7351-Grey Bitty Blooms – Grey	⅓ yard	See instructions to cut two 2" circles for the openings on House #1.
(G)	CX7350-Turq Pretty Grid – Turq	% yard	 Cut five 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding. Place a 7 ½" square of fusible web on the wrong side of the remaining material and cut two ¾" x 6 ½" strips for House #1. See instructions to cut one 2" circle for House #4.
(H)	CX7350-Pink Pretty Grid – Pink	⅓ yard	See instructions to cut (1) roof for House #3, five daisies and four flower centers.
(1)	CX7350-Yellow Pretty Grid – Yellow	⅓ yard	See instructions to cut four daisies and five flower centers.
(J)	CX7350-Limeade Pretty Grid – Limeade	⅓ yard	• See instructions to cut two grass #2, two grass #3, two grass #6, two grass #7, twelve right leaves and twelve left leaves.
(K)	CX7350-Green Pretty Grid – Green	⅓ yard	 See instructions to cut six 1 ½" circles for House #3. See instructions to cut eight vine #1, four vine #2, two grass #1, two grass #4, two grass #5, two grass #8, two stem #1, two stem #2, two stem #3 and two stem #4. Place a 3" x 7" strip of fusible web on the wrong side of the remaining fabric and cut one 1 ¾" x 6" strip for House #2.
(L)	CX7350-Aqua Pretty Grid – Aqua	⅓ yard	• See instructions to cut five tulips and one 2 ½" circle for House #2.
(M)	SC5333-Ginger Cotton Couture – Ginger	⅓ yard	 Place a 4" x WOF strip of fusible web on the wrong side of the fabric. Cut one ¾" x 16" strip for House #1, one ¾" x 9 ½" strip for House #2, one ¾" x 20" strip for House #3 and one ¾" x 13 ½" strip for House #4. See instructions to cut ten posts from the remaining fabric without fusible on the back.
(N)	CX7351-Aqua Bitty Blooms – Aqua	⅓ yard	 Place a 9" square of fusible web on the wrong side of the material and cut one 7" x 8" square for House #3.
(O)	CX7351-Yellow Bitty Blooms – Yellow	⅓ yard	• Place a 6" square of fusible web on the wrong side of the material. Cut one 4 ½' square for House #4.
Backi	ng CX7351-White Bitty Blooms – White	3 yards	 Cut two 54" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together and trim to make the 54" x 54" pieced backing.

You will also need:

^{• 54&}quot; x 54" batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, rotary cutter and mat.



Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.


While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

Block Assembly


1. Follow Figure 1 and trim the 6" x 9" Fabric E strip as shown to make House #1.



2. Follow Figure 2 and trim the 1 ¾" x 6" Fabric K strip as shown to make the roof for House #2.



- 3. Follow Figure 3 and trim one ³/₄" x 6 ¹/₄" Fabric G piece as shown to make the left side roof of House #1.
- 4. Follow Figure 4 and trim one ³/₄" x 6 ¹/₄" Fabric G piece as shown to make the right side roof of House #1.



- 5. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- 6. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.

7. Refer to Figure 5 to arrange and press the assorted birdhouses, flowers, vines and grass as shown.






8. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the Center Block.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 9. Sew one 2" x 33 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 2" x 36 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 10. Sew one 5 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 5 ½" Fabric D square to each end of one 5 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric B strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 11. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 12. Sew the five 2 ½" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end-to-end with 45° seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press
- 13. Bind as desired. 5
