





### **Cutting Requirements**



two (2) 4.5" x 3.5" one (1) 12.5" x 4.5"





three (3) 4.5" x 3.5" four (4) 12.5" x 1.75" one (1) 12.5" x 2"



one (1) 4.5" x 3.5" two (2) 12.5" x 1.25"



two (2) 4.5" x 3.5" two (2) 12.5" x 1.25"



two (2) 4.5" x 3.5" one (1) 10.5" x 3" one (1) 7.5" x 3"



two (2) 4.5" x 3.5" one (1) 12.5" x 4.5" four (4) 12.5" x 1.25"

SC5333-Jewel



Cut eight (8) 2.25" x WOF strips, sew end to end to create one long binding strip



Cut seven (7) 1.25" x WOF strips, subcut into nine (9) 17", nine (9) 6.5" & 36 (4) 1.25" squares

Cut two (2) 2" x WOF strips, subcut into two (2) 6.75", one (1) 5.75", four (4) 5" and two (2) 3.75" lengths



SC5333-Bright White

Cut one (1) 12.5" x WOF strip, subcut vertically into the following lengths: one (1) 3.5", two (2) 3.25", four (4) 1.75", eight (8) 1". From the remaining section, cut the following pieces vertically: six (6) 1.5" x 11.75", one (1) 3.5" x 8.5", one (1) 3.5" x 7.5"

Cut one (1) 5.5" x WOF strip, subcut into: two (2) 10.5" x 5.5", one (1) 20" x 4" length



SC5333-Indigo

Cut four (4) 3" x WOF strips, piece end to end and subcut into two (2) 63.5" x 3" strips

Cut two (2) 3.5" x WOF strips, piece end to end and subcut into one (1) 63.5" x 3.5" strip

Cut two (2) 4" x WOF strips, piece end to end and subcut into one (1) 63.5" x 4" strip

Cut two (2) 4.5" x WOF strips, piece end to end and subcut into one (1) 63.5" x 4.5" strip

Cut two (2) 5" x WOF strips, piece end to end and subcut into one (1) 63.5" x 5" strip

Cut three (3) 4.25" x WOF strips, subcut into six (6) 17.25" lengths

Cut three (3) 3.5" x WOF strips, subcut into six (6) 17.25" lengths

Cut three (3) 5.75" x WOF strips, subcut into four (4) 7.5", eight (8) 5.75", two (2) 6.5", four (4) 4.5" lengths and four (4) 2.75" x 3.75" pieces

Cut two (2) 2.75" x WOF strips, subcut into eight (8) 5", two (2) 5.75" and four (4) 6.75" lengths

Cut one (1) 3" x WOF strip, subcut into four (4) 3.5" lengths and two (2) 10.5" x 2.75" pieces

Cut four (4) 2.75" x WOF strips, subcut into two (2) 11.75", two (2) 9.5", two (2) 8.5" and two (2) 8.25" lengths

Cut five (5) 1" x WOF strips, subcut into ninety-six (96) 1" squares


Cut one (1) .75" x WOF strip, subcut into two (2) 20" lengths

Cut two (2) 2.5" x WOF strips, subcut into eighteen (18) 3.5" and two (2) 5.5" lengths

Cut one (1) 2.25" x WOF strip, subcut into one(1) 17" length, (2) two 4.25" x 2", and one (1) 17" x 1.75"

**Cut one (1) 3.25" x WOF strip**, subcut into one(1) 17" length and one (1) 17" x 1.25" piece

### Piecing Instructions - 20 Individual Macarons



1. Sew the white filling for all 20 macarons at one time by sewing a 20" x .75" navy strip down the length of both sides of a 4" x 20" white block. Trim into 20 - 1" strips.



2. Take one of the 4.5" x 3.5" rectangles and cut in half lengthwise to make two (2) 4.5" x 1.75" pieces.



3. Start with a pair of 4.5" x 1.75" rectangles. Place four navy 1" squares, marked with a diagonal line, on corners as shown.



4. Sew directly on the marked line.




5. Trim, leaving a .25" seam allowance.




6. Press corners back.



7. Sew one of the centers you made in the first step inbetween the top and bottom macaron pieces. Make sure the corners are oriented properly.



8. Congratulations, you've just made a macaron. Now make 19 more!







### Piecing Instructions - 9 Cake Stands

There are four different height cake stands. The diagram below shows the quantities you will need to make of each one for a total of nine. Basic instructions are the same for all so I will just show instructions to make the first one, Cake Stand F. Please use the cutting dimensions in each diagram as a guide for which size pieces to sew together to make the different height variations. The first measurement given is always the width.


#### Cake Stand F (make 2)

#### Cake Stand F



1. Start with a pair of dark blue 2.75" x 3.75" rectangles. Place four teal 1" squares, marked with a diagonal line, on corners as shown.




2. Sew directly on the marked line.



3. Trim, leaving a .25" seam allowance.



4. Press corners back.



5. Sew a 2" x 3.75" teal rectangle inbetween these two pieces as shown to make the center cake stand leg.



6. Sew 6.5" x 1.25" skinny teal rectangle to the bottom of the cake stand leg.

7. Sew the two 5.75" x 6.5" dark blue pieces to either side of the center leg pieces.



8. Lastly, sew the top of the cake plate on.






### Piecing Diagram - 9 Cakes

There are five different cake blocks (see diagrams below), in nine fabric variations. I've given instructions for how to make each of the 5 cake blocks, please use the quilt diagram on the last page for fabric placement on the 4 additional variations.





# Piecing Instructions - Cakes A & B

There are five different cake blocks, in nine different fabric variations. I've given instructions for how to make one of each cake block style, please use the quilt diagram on the last page for fabric placement on the additional variants.


Cake A - Layer Cake


1. Sew a .875" x 4.5" white dark blue strip to either short side of the a 11.75" x 4.5" piece. Trim into three (3) 1.5" strips.




2. Sew yellow strips and white strips together alternately as shown above.




3. Sew remaining dark blue pieces in the order shown below.




Cake B - Striped



1. Sew white and patterned strips together as shown below.



2. Sew remaining dark blue pieces in the order shown below.



### Piecing Instructions - Cakes

These two cakes have different sized tiers, but their construction technique is the same. I've given instructions for Cake D, but you can use them for Cake E as well. Refer to the diagrams below for reference in which size fabric pieces to use for each.


Cake C - Classic Fondant




1. Place two 1" dark blue squares marked diagonally on upper corners of both white rectangles as shown. Sew on drawn line. Trim and press open. (See diagrams on left for reference).




2. Sew patterned bands to white pieces as shown.



3. Finish piecing the block in the order shown below.




Cake D - Tall Tiered



### Piecing Instructions - Cakes

There are five different cake blocks, in nine different fabric variations. I've given instructions for how to make one of each cake block style, please use the quilt diagram on the last page for fabric placement on the additional variants.

Cake E - Simple Fondant




1. Place two 1" dark blue squares marked diagonally on upper corners of white rectangle as shown. Sew on drawn line. Trim and press open.



2. Sew the three cake pieces together as shown.



3. Sew dark blue background pieces in the order shown below.



### Cakes / Row Assembly

- 1. Match up cakes with appropriate height cake stands, and sew together. Each block should measure 17" x 17.25".
- 2. Piece cakes into three separate rows, by sewing 3.5" x 17.25" dark blue strips in between the cakes and 4.25" x 17.25" strips on the ends. Use the Assembly Diagram on the next page for reference.
- 3. Using the Assembly diagram on the next page, piece macarons into two separate rows by sewing 2.5" x 3.5" dark blue pieces in between the macarons and 3" x 3.5" pieces on the ends.
- 4. Piece quilt together in rows with dark blue strips in between the pieced macaron and cake rows. Again, use the Assembly Diagram for reference.
- 5. Quilt and bind as desired and you're finished!
