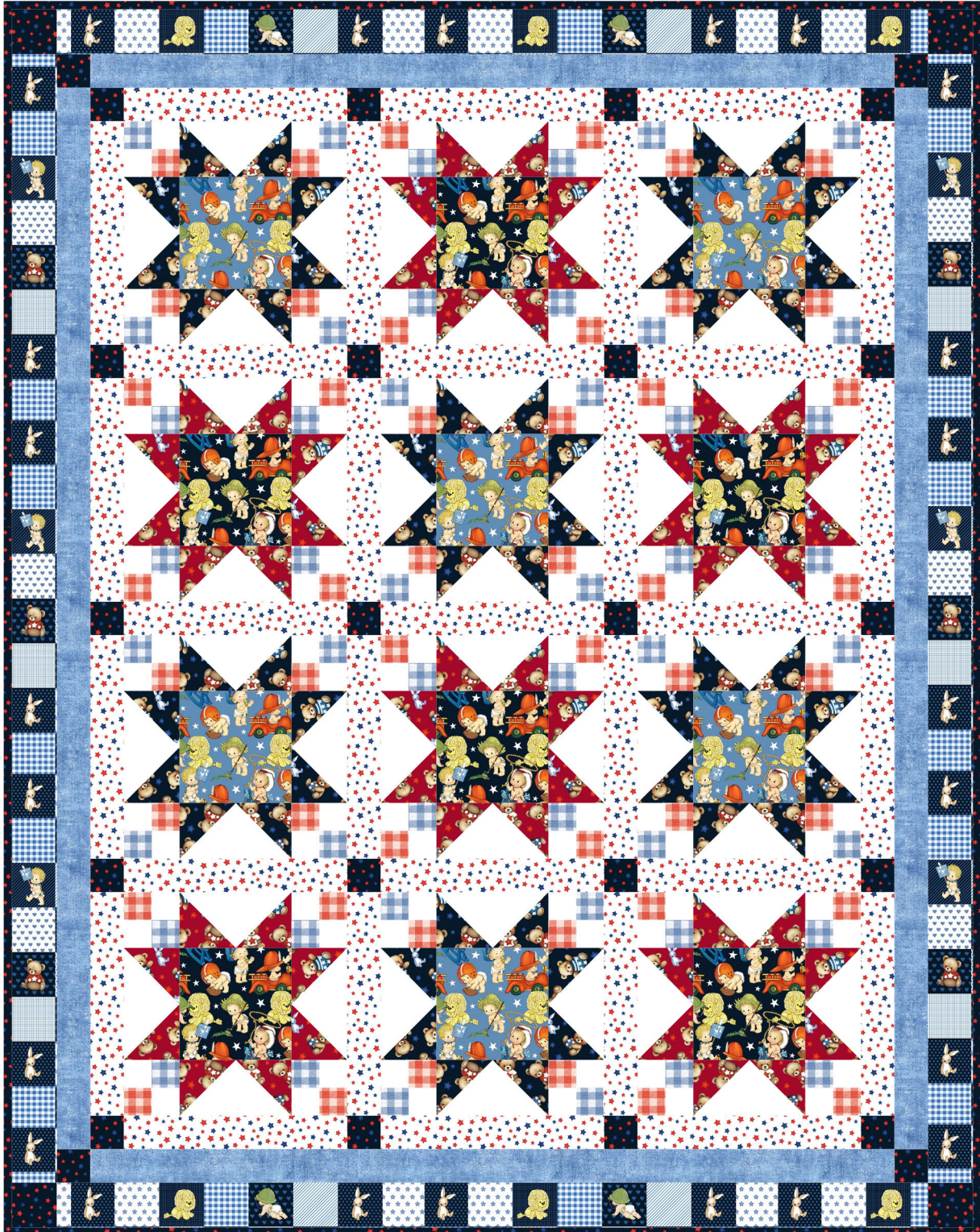

# Rodeo

## 1/4" Seam Allowance Check

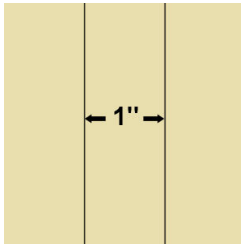
To check if your seam is accurate, cut three 1 1/2" x 3" pieces from scrap fabric.

Sew the pieces together along the 3" side, using what you believe is a 1/4" seam.

Press away from the center piece.

Measure.

The center piece should be exactly 1" wide.



If, when you measure, the center is less than 1", your seam allowance is too large. You need to move the needle to the right.

If it's more than 1", your seam allowance is too small and you need to move the needle to the left.

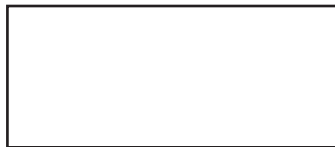
Consult your machine's owner's manual for instructions on moving your needle position.

Repeat this check until your center strip measures correctly.

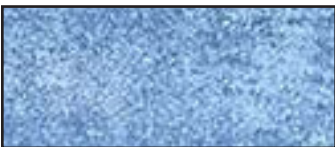

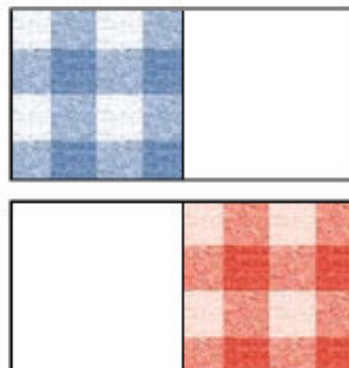

KEY	CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS	WOF=width of fabric
A	(3) 1 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>4</sub> " x WOF	
B	(6) 1 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>4</sub> " x WOF (2) 6 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " x WOF. Subcut: (12) 6 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " squares	
C	(3) 1 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>4</sub> " x WOF	
D	(3) 3 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " x WOF. Subcut: (24) 3 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " squares	
E	(6) 5 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " squares	
F	(3) 3 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " x WOF. Subcut: (24) 3 <sup>3</sup> / <sub>8</sub> " squares	
G	(6) 5 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " squares	
H	(1) 2" x WOF. Subcut: (20) 2" squares (1) 2 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " x WOF. Subcut: (4) 2 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " squares and (4) 2" squares (6) 2 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " x WOF for binding	
I	(2) 10 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " x WOF. Subcut: (31) 2" x 10 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " rectangles	
J	(5) 2" x WOF	
K	(5) 2 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> " x WOF, fussy cut on motif	

### Block A:

Make 6

1. Stitch one fabric A and one fabric B 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips together to make a stripset. Make three stripsets. Cut into (48) 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 3" pieces.
2. Repeat step 1 using three fabric C and three fabric B 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips.
3. Pair the pieces from steps 1-2 to make (48) four-patch blocks. Square to 3".



4. Use the technique sheet on page 6 to make flying geese units using one fabric B  $6\frac{1}{8}$ " square and four fabric D  $3\frac{3}{8}$ " squares. Trim to  $3" \times 5\frac{1}{2}"$ . Make (24) units.
5. Combine four flying geese units, four four-patch units and one fabric E  $5\frac{1}{2}"$  square to complete the block. Square to  $10\frac{1}{2}"$ . Make six blocks.



### Block B:

Make 6

6. Repeat step 4 using one fabric B  $6\frac{1}{8}$ " square and four fabric F  $3\frac{3}{8}$ " squares. Make (24) units.
7. Combine four flying geese units, four four-patch units and one fabric G  $5\frac{1}{2}"$  square to complete the block, noticing the rotation of the four-patch units. Square to  $10\frac{1}{2}"$ . Make six blocks.



### Assembly & Finishing:

8. Use the assembly diagram on page 5 to arrange and stitch the blocks together, adding the fabric H  $2"$  squares and the fabric I  $2" \times 10\frac{1}{2}"$  rectangles.
9. Stitch five fabric J  $2" \times$  WOF strips together end-to-end. Cut two  $2" \times 48"$  pieces and add to the left and right sides of the quilt. Cut two  $2" \times 36\frac{1}{2}"$  pieces, adding one fabric H  $2"$  square to each end then add to the top and bottom of the quilt.
10. Repeat step 9 using five fabric K  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times$  WOF strips and four fabric H  $2\frac{1}{2}"$  squares.
11. Layer, baste and quilt as desired.
12. Bind with six fabric H  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times$  WOF strips.

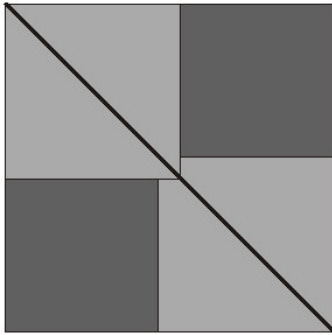
## Assembly Diagram



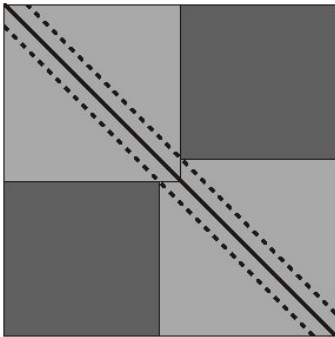
## No-Waste Flying Geese

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the smaller squares.

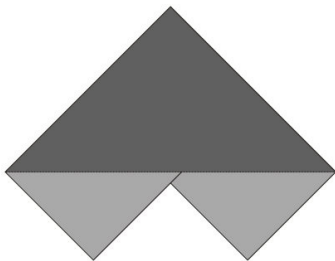
Add two smaller squares to one larger square, right sides together, as shown.



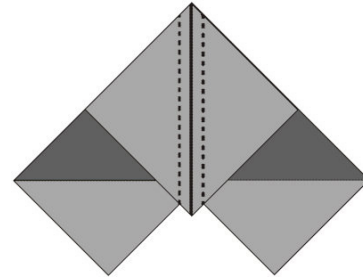
Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.



Cut on the drawn line and press small triangles outward.



Add one small square, right sides together, as shown. Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.



Cut on the drawn line and press small triangles outward. Trim to the size indicated in the pattern.

Each set of one large square and four small squares makes four flying geese units.
