Cutting instructions

Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge.

	Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
(A)	PC6024 Drama Queen - Electric	$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut one 6 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into six 6 $\frac{1}{2}$" squares.
(B)	SG6149 Summer Heather - Raspberry	$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut one 6 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into six 6 $\frac{1}{2}$" squares.• Cut one 4 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into four 4 $\frac{1}{2}$" squares.
(C)	SG6151 Cottage Path - Raspberry	$\frac{2}{3}$ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut two 1 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 1 $\frac{1}{2}$" x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$" strips.• Cut three 1 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 1 $\frac{1}{2}$" x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$" strips.• See instructions to cut twelve half-circles.
(D)	SG6151 Cottage Path - Turquoise	$\frac{2}{3}$ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut two 1 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 1 $\frac{1}{2}$" x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$" strips.• Cut three 1 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 1 $\frac{1}{2}$" x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$" strips.• See instructions to cut twelve half-circles.
(E)	CX1492 Ta Dot - Confection	$\frac{1}{3}$ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• See instructions to cut twelve half-circles.
(F)	CX1492 Ta Dot - Robins Egg	1 $\frac{1}{4}$ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut four 4 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, and cut two 4 $\frac{1}{2}$" x 68 $\frac{1}{2}$" strips.• Cut three 4 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, and cut two 4 $\frac{1}{2}$" x 52 $\frac{1}{2}$" strips.• See instructions to cut twelve half circles.
(G)	CX1492 Ta Dot - Black	$\frac{7}{8}$ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut four 5 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 5 $\frac{1}{2}$" squares.
(H)	CX1492 Ta Dot - Bright White	$\frac{7}{8}$ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut four 5 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 5 $\frac{1}{2}$" squares.
(I)	SG6150 Delightful Stripe - Raspberry	1 $\frac{1}{4}$ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, and cut two 2 $\frac{1}{2}$" x 64 $\frac{1}{2}$" strips.• Cut three 2 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, and cut two 2 $\frac{1}{2}$" x 52 $\frac{1}{2}$" strips.• Cut seven 2 $\frac{1}{2}$" x WOF strips for the binding.

Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge.

	Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
(J)	SC5333 Cotton Couture - Bright White	2 ⅓ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut three 8 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.• Cut three 16 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 4 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
Backing	SG6146 Daisy Flutter - Noir	4 yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut two 68" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 84" pieced backing.

You will also need:

• 68" x 84" Batting, fusible web, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, rotary cutter and mat.

Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.

While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

Applique Assembly

1. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
2. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
3. Fold one Fabric D half-circle in half and crease to mark the center. Fold one 4 ½" x 8-1/2" Fabric J strip in half and crease to mark the center. Position the Fabric D piece on top of the Fabric J strip, aligning the center marks and the raw edges on the straight edge of the half circle with the raw edge of the J strip (Fig. 1). Press the half-circle in place.
4. Repeat Step 3 to press the remaining Fabric D half circles and twelve Fabric E half-circles onto the 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric J strips.
5. Repeat Step 3 to center and press twelve Fabric F half-circles and twelve Fabric C half-circles onto the twenty-four 4 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric J strips.
6. Using a decorate stitch such as a blanket or satin stitch to finish the raw edges of the half-circles along the arc. DO NOT STITCH along the straight edge of the half-circle. This will be caught in the seam during assembly.

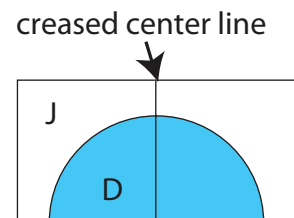

Block One Assembly

7. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of one 6 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew one 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and bottom of the 6 1/2" Fabric A square to complete one Block One center (Fig. 2). Repeat to make six Block One centers total.
8. Sew one 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" D/J applied strip to each side of one Block One center. Sew one Fabric 4 1/2" x 16 1/2" F/J applied strip to the top and bottom of the Block One center to complete one Block One square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make six Block One squares.
9. Place one 5 1/2" Fabric G square on the top left corner of one Block One square, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 5). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.
10. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a 5 1/2" Fabric G square to each of the remaining corners of the Block One square to make one Block One (Fig. 7).
11. Repeat Steps 7-8 to make six Block One squares total.

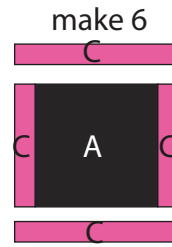

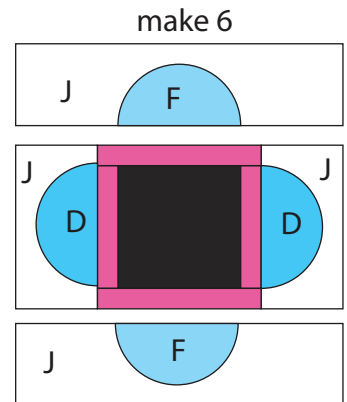

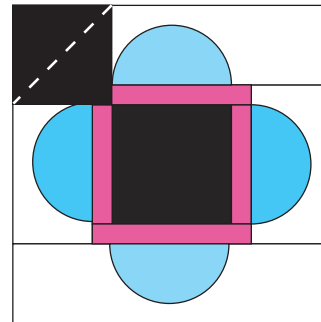

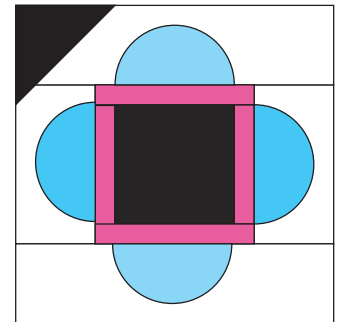

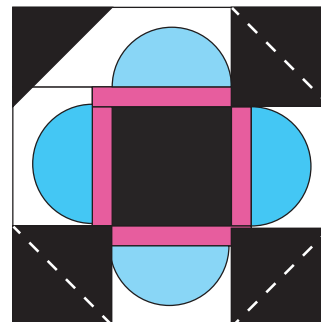

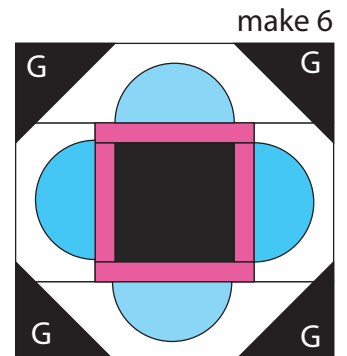

Block Two Assembly

12. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of one 6 1/2" Fabric B square. Sew one 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and bottom of the 6 1/2" Fabric B square to complete one Block Two center (Fig. 8). Repeat to make six Block Two centers total.
13. Sew one 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" E/J applied strip to each side of one Block Two center. Sew one Fabric 4 1/2" x 16 1/2" C/J applied strip to the top and bottom of the Block Two center to complete one Block Two square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make six Block Two squares.

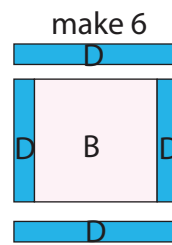

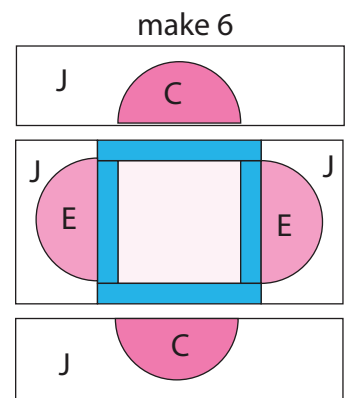

14. Repeat Steps 3-4 to flip and sew four 5-1/2" Fabric H squares on the four corners of each Block Two square (Fig. 10)
15. Repeat Steps 12-13 to make six Block Twos total.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

16. Sew two Block Ones and one Block Two together to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
17. Sew two Block Twos and one Block One together to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
18. Sew the four rows together, in numerical order, to make the quilt top.
19. Sew one 2 1/2" x 64 1/2" Fabric I strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 2 1/2" x 52 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
20. Sew one 4 1/2" x 68 1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 4 1/2" Fabric B square to each end of one 4 1/2" x 52 1/2" Fabric F strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
21. Layer and quilt as desired.
22. Sew the seven 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric I strips together, end-to-end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press
23. Bind as desired.

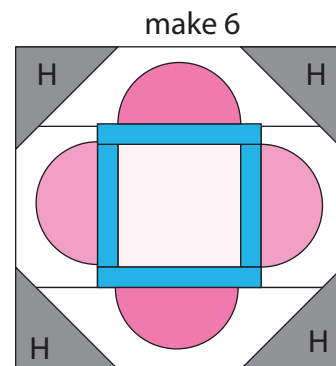
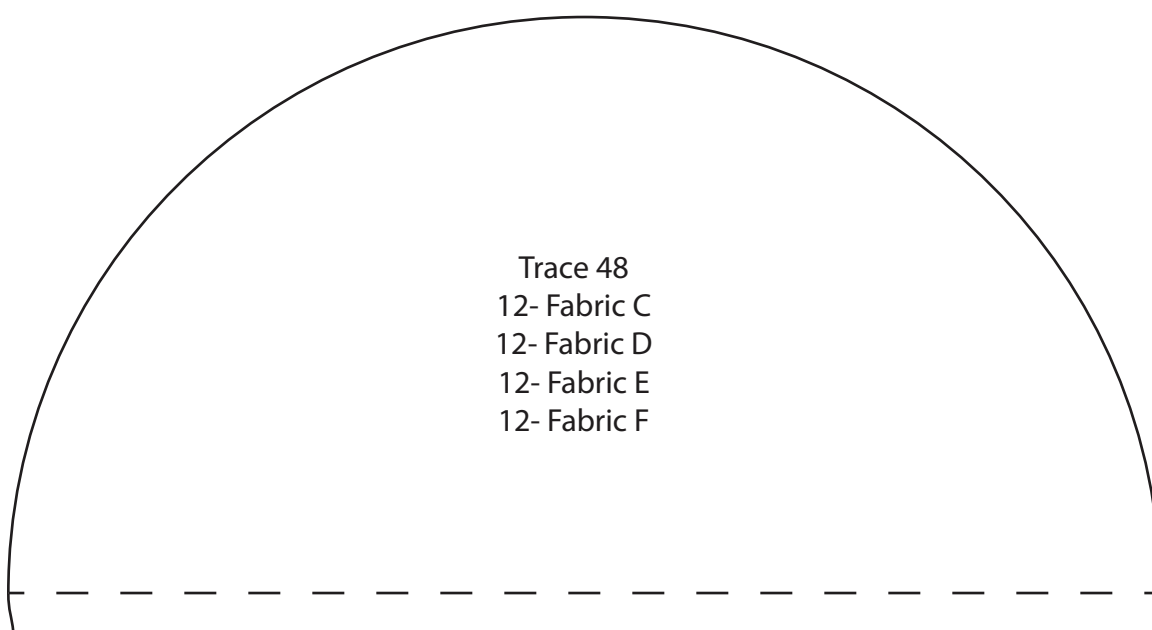
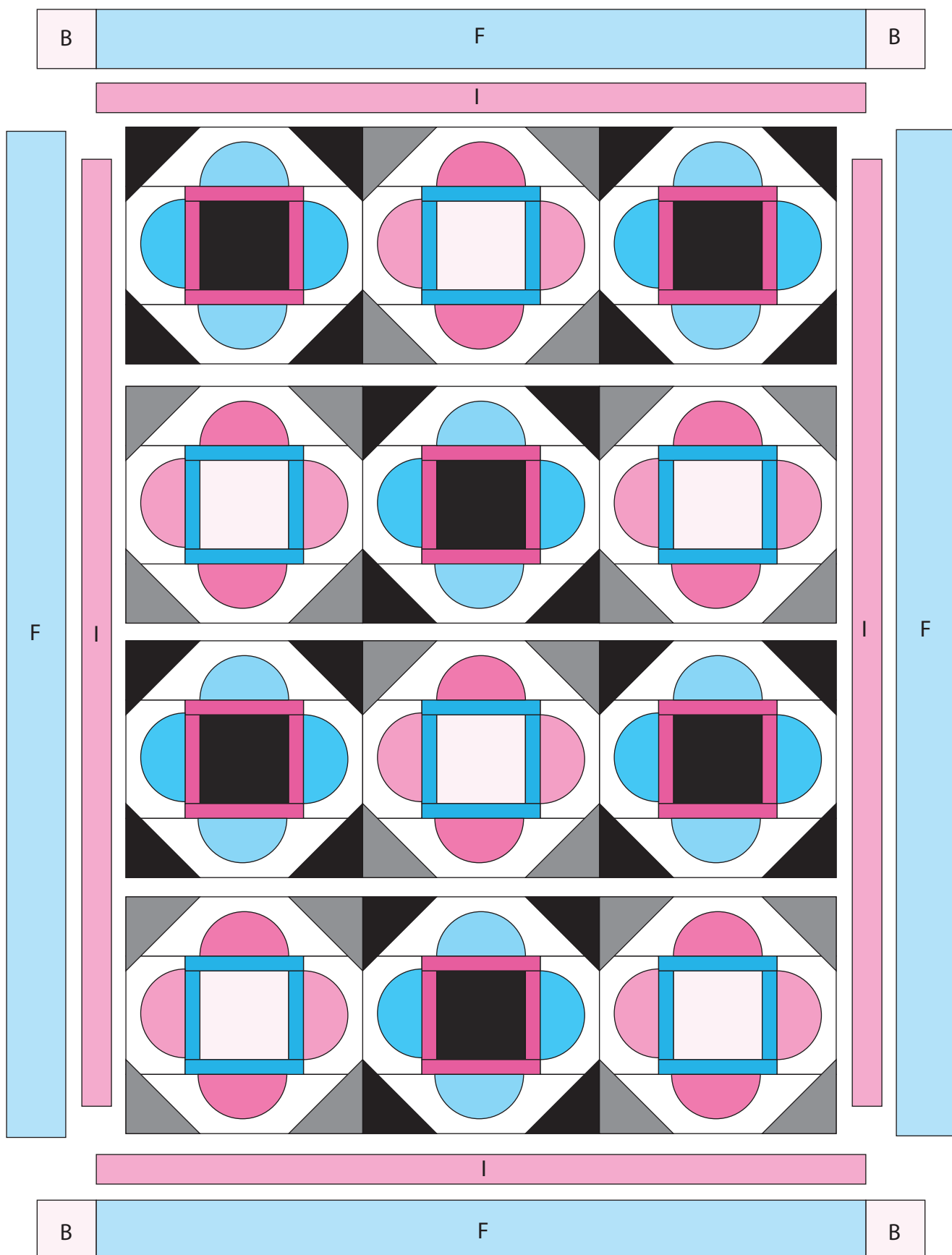
