# "Preppy Pups"

Quilt by Emily Herrick

Size: Approximately 61" W x 67" H Skill Level : Intermediate

## Materials

Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
SC5333 White	2 yards	(6) 2" x WOF - (120) 2" x 2" squares (3) 2" x WOF - (24) 2" x 5" pieces (2) 2" x WOF - (24) 2" x 3 1/2" pieces (6) 2" x WOF for stop border (6) 3 1/2" x WOF - (48) 3 1/2" x 5" pieces (4) 3 1/2" x WOF - (48) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares
SC5333 Charcoal	1 2/3 yards	(5) 2" x WOF - (24) 2" x 8" strips (5) 2" x WOF - (96) 2" x 2" squares (5) 3 1/2" x WOF - (48) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares (7) 2 1/2" x WOF for Binding
CX4835 Magenta	fat 1/8	(2 or 3) 5" x 6 1/2" of each print:  TOTAL of (24) 5" x 6 1/2" pieces

### Also Needed:

69" x 75" backing, 69 x 75" batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, rotary cutter, acrylic ruler, mat.

**\* Press all seams OPEN unless otherwise noted.**

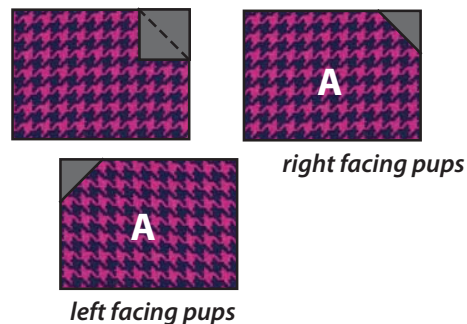
## PUPPY CONSTRUCTION

1.) Place a 2" x 2" charcoal square in the corner of a 5" x 6 1/2" print piece, right sides together, and stitch from corner to corner as shown. Trim excess leaving a 1/4" seam and press block open.

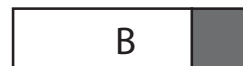
Make 12 for right facing pups.

Make another 12 with the corner on the other side for left facing pups.

This is piece "A"



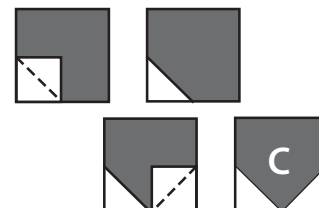
2.) Sew a 2" x 2" charcoal square to the end of a 2" x 5 1/2" white rectangle. Make 24. These will be piece "B".



3.) Place a 2" x 2" white square in the corner of a 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" charcoal square. Stitch a line diagonally across the white square. Trim excess leaving 1/4" seam allowance and press open.

Place another 2" x 2" white square in the next corner and sew diagonal line as shown. Trim and press.

Make 24. These will be piece "C"



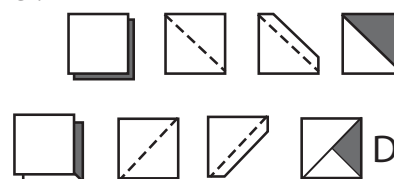
4.) Place a 2" x 2" charcoal square and a 2" x 2" white square right sides together. Sew a diagonal line from one corner to the other.

Trim excess leaving 1/4" seam and press block open.

Place another 2" x 2" white square on top of the finished piece.

Sew a line from corner to corner, the opposite direction as the diagonal seam on the first piece.

Trim and press open. This is piece "D". Make 24.



5.) Place a 2" x 2" charcoal square in the corner of a 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" white square, right sides together, and stitch from corner to corner as shown.

Trim excess leaving a 1/4" seam and press block open.

Make 24.

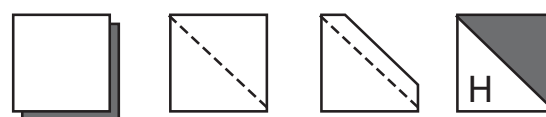


6.) Place a 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" charcoal square and a 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" white square right sides together.

Sew a diagonal line from one corner to the other.

Trim excess leaving 1/4" seam allowance and press block open.

This is piece "H". Make 24.



7.) Place a 2" x 3 1/2" white rectangle at the end of a 2" x 8" charcoal strip as shown in the diagram.

Sew a diagonal line across the end as shown.

Trim excess leaving a 1/4" seam allowance and press open.

Make 12 for right facing pups.

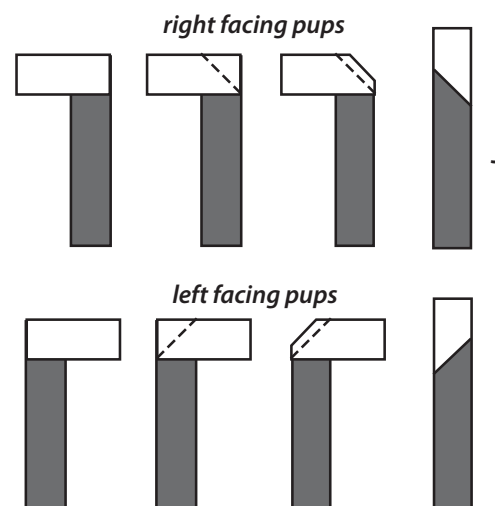
For left facing puppies, align a 2" x 3 1/2" white rectangle at the end of a 2" x 8" charcoal strip. Instead of laying it off to the left, this time lay it off to the right as shown.

Stitch a line from one corner to the other as shown.

Trim excess and press open.

Make 12 for left facing pups.

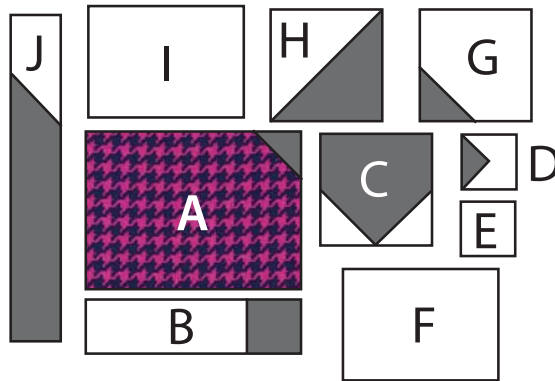
This is piece "J"



7.) Lay out pieces for a Right-Facing pup as shown.

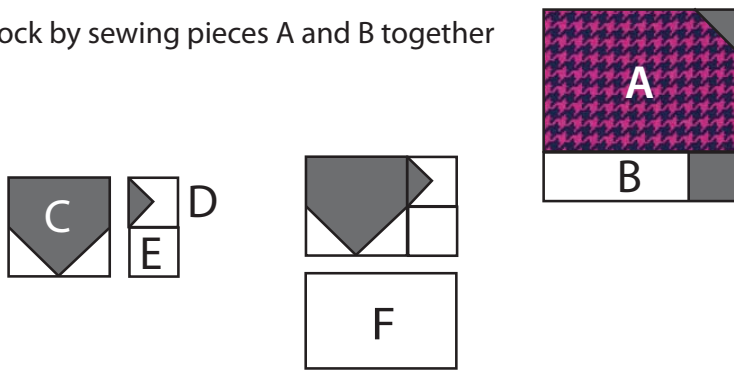
8.) Fill in pieces with a 3 1/2" x 5" white piece for "I" and "F". Place a 2" x 2" white square for piece "E".

9.) As you piece each block it helps to place each piece back in its place after sewing. This helps to keep all the pieces in order.



9.) Begin assembling the preppy pup block by sewing pieces A and B together to form the first section.

10.) Sew pieces D and E together. Then attach to piece C. Next, attach piece F to complete this section.



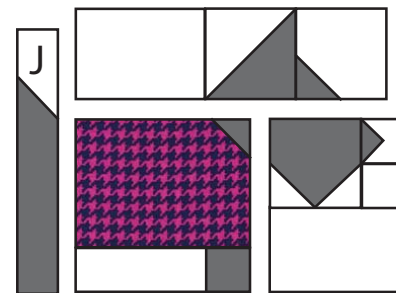
11.) Sew pieces G, H and I together for another section.



12.) Sew section A/B to section C/D/E/F. Then attach section G/H/I.

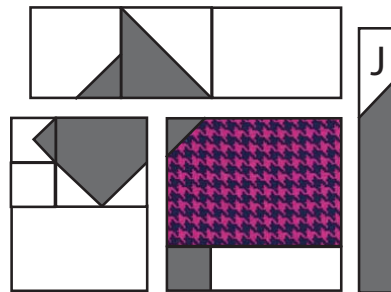
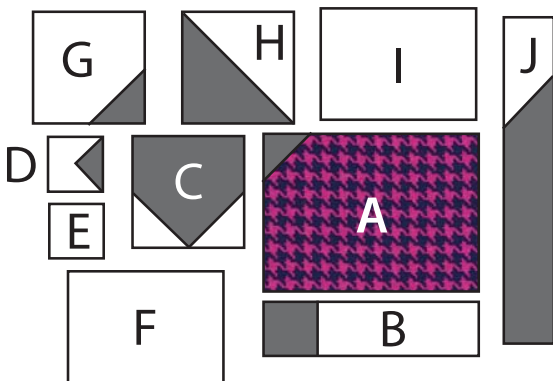
13.) Lastly, attach piece J to complete the right facing puppy block. Make 12.

Finished block should measure 9 1/2" x 12 1/2".



17.) Lay out pieces for a left facing pup and sew together in the same order as before. Make 12.

Finished block should measure 9 1/2" x 12 1/2"



## QUILT ASSEMBLY

- 1.) Lay the preppy pup blocks in rows of four alternating the direction each row is facing.
- 2.) Sew the blocks in each row together then sew rows together. Press.
- 3.) Piece together 2" x WOF white strips end to end as needed. Cut (2) 2" x 54 1/2" strips and sew to each side of the quilt top. Press.
- 4.) Cut (2) 2" x 51 1/2" strips and sew to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press.
- 5.) Piece outer border 5 1/2" x WOF strips end to end as needed. Cut (2) 5 1/2" x 57 1/2" strips and sew to each side of the quilt top. Press.
- 6.) Cut (2) 5 1/2" x 61 1/2" strips and sew to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press.
- 7.) Layer backing, batting and quilt top. Baste.
- 8.) Quilt as desired.
- 9.) Join binding strips together as needed. Bind.
