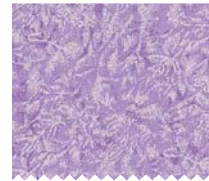

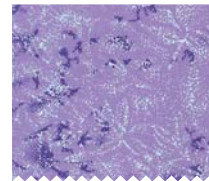

Size: Approximately 42" x 62" Skill Level: Intermediate

### Materials

#### Cutting instructions

**Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge.**

	Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
(A)	DC6437-Nite From Dawn to Dusk Panel	1 Panel	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Fussy cut one 22 ½" x 42 ½" strip.</li> </ul>
(B)	CM0376-Avocado Fairy Frost	¾ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut two 1 ½" x 42 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut two 1 ½" x 24 ½" strips.</li> <li>• See instructions to cut twelve right facing single scrolls.</li> <li>• See instructions to cut twelve left facing single scrolls.</li> <li>• See instructions to cut two small double scrolls.</li> </ul>
(C)	CM0376-Wisteria Fairy Frost	½ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut one 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into two 2 ⅞" squares and four 2 ½" squares.</li> <li>• Cut four 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strip into sixty-four 2 ½" squares.</li> </ul>
(D)	CM0376-Bling Fairy Frost	1 ½ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut one 2 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into two 2 ⅞" squares.</li> <li>• Cut five 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into eighty 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut three 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with a diagonal seam, and cut two 4 ½" x 48 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut two 4 ½" x 36 ½" strips.</li> </ul>
(E)	CM0376-Moss Fairy Frost	1 ¼ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut four 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end with a diagonal seam, and cut two 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut two 1 ½" x 42 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut six 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding</li> <li>• See instructions to cut twelve right facing single scrolls.</li> <li>• See instructions to cut twelve left facing single scrolls.</li> <li>• See instructions to cut two large double scrolls.</li> </ul>
(F)	CM0376-Fancy Fairy Frost	⅝ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut six 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into ninety-six 2 ½" squares.</li> </ul>
Backing	CM0376-Peri Fairy Frost	3 yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut two 50" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together and trim to make the 50" x 70" pieced backing.</li> </ul>

#### **You will also need:**

- 50" x 70" batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, rotary cutter and mat.

Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.

While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

## Block Assembly

1. Place one  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D square on top of one  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make two DC units (Fig. 3). Trim the DC units to measure  $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make four  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " DC units total.

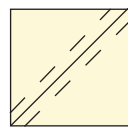

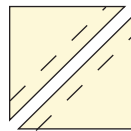

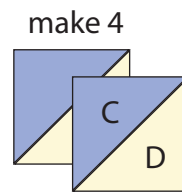

2. Place one  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square on the left side of one  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 5). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.
3. Place another  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square on the right side of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 7). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make one CDC unit.
4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make thirty-four CDC units total.
5. Repeat Steps 2-3 using forty-six  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strips and ninety-two  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F squares to make forty-six FDF units total (Fig. 8).

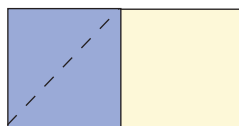

## Quilt Top Assembly (Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

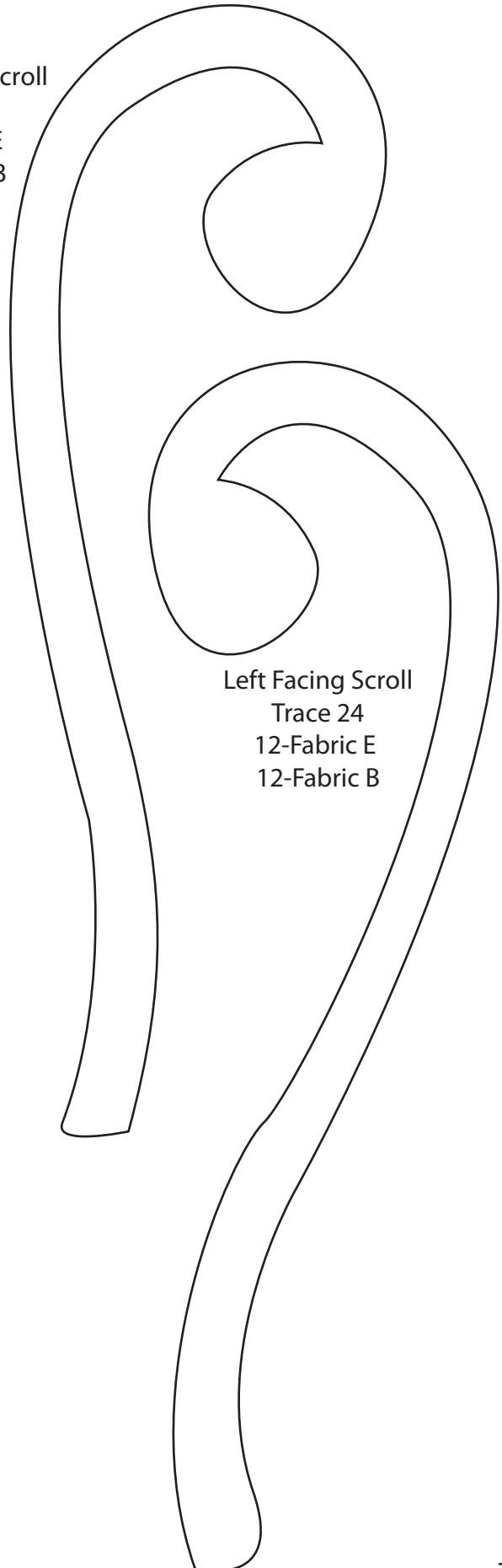
1. Sew one  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the  $22\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip. Sew one  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $24\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A strip to make the center block.
2. Sew eleven CDC units together, end to end, to make one strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew one strip to each side of the center block.

3. Sew two DC units and six CDC units together to make one strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and bottom of the center block.
4. Sew one 4 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the center block. Sew one 4 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the center block.
5. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
6. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
7. Refer to the quilt photo to arrange and press the twenty four Fabric B single scrolls, two Fabric B double scrolls, twenty-four single Fabric E scrolls and the two Fabric E double scrolls onto the 4 ½" Fabric D borders.
8. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the quilt top.
9. Sew fourteen FDF units together, end to end, to make one strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top.
10. Sew two 2 ½" Fabric F squares and nine FDF units together to make one strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
11. Sew one 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.
12. Layer and quilt as desired.
13. Sew the six 2 ½" x WOF Fabric E strips together, end-to-end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press
14. Bind as desired.

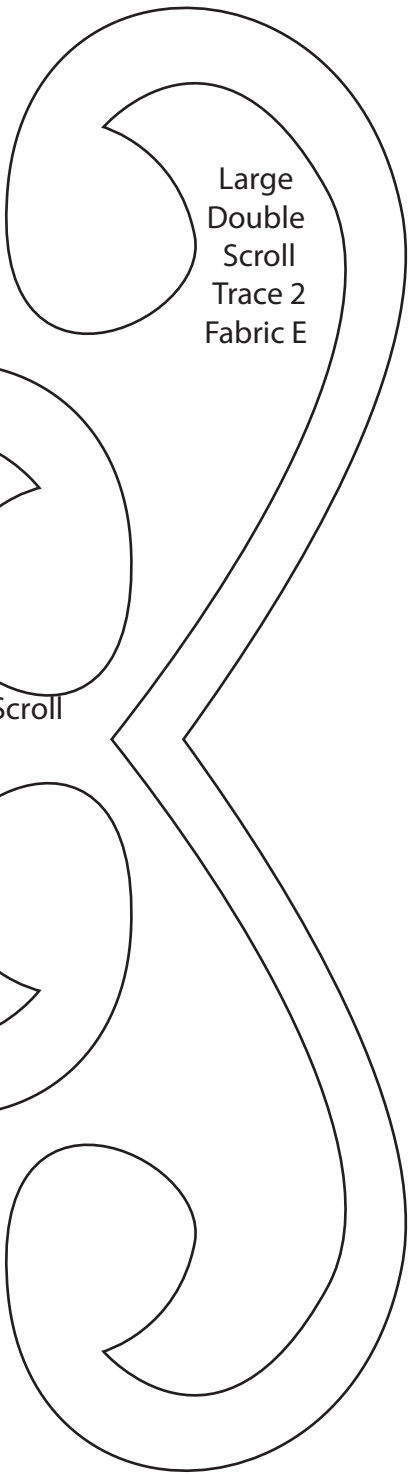


Quilt Layout

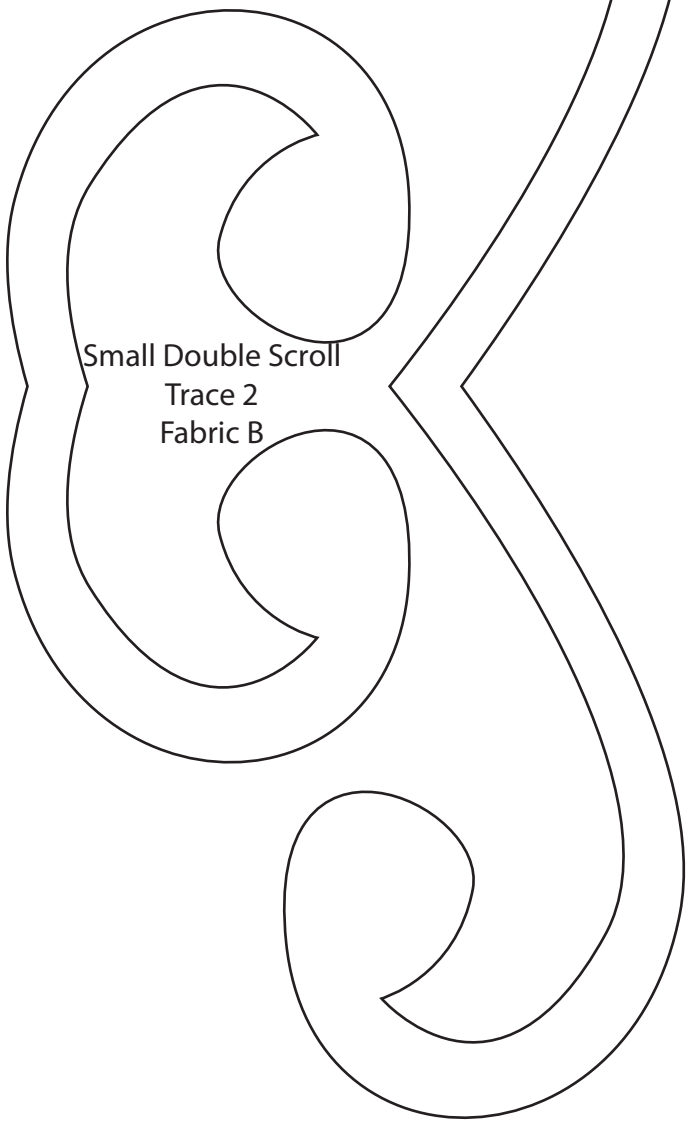
Right Facing Scroll
