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



MC3744-Mist Quarter Dot – Mist 4 yards (Backing)



MC6305-Glitz Confetti Border – Glitz 2 ½ yards



MC6305-Mist Confetti Border – Mist 1 ¼ yards

### **Materials**

#### **Cutting instructions**

Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge.

	Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
(A)	MC3744-Glitz Quarter Dot – Glitz	2 yards	<ul> <li>Cut six 4 ½" X WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into fifty-four 4 ½" squares.</li> <li>Cut five 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into seventy-two 2 ½" squares.</li> <li>Cut two 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.</li> <li>Cut four 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, and cut two 2 ½" x 64 ½" strips.</li> <li>Cut three 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, and cut two 2 ½" x 52 ½" strips.</li> </ul>
(B)	MC6321-Mist Sleek Chevron – Mist	2 yards	<ul> <li>Cut six 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into fifty-four 4 ½" squares.</li> <li>Cut five 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into seventy-two 2 ½" squares.</li> <li>Cut one 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.</li> <li>Cut two 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.</li> <li>Cut seven 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.</li> </ul>
(C)	MC6305-Glitz Confetti Border – Glitz	2 ½ yards	• Cut forty-eight 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips from the heavier confetti sections of the fabric.
(D)	SC5333-Bright White Cotton Couture – White	½ yard	• Cut two 4 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 4 1/8" squares.
(E)	MC5709-Mist Chic Chevron – Mist	⅔ yard	• Cut three 4 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 4 1/8" squares.
(F)	SC5333-Mist Cotton Couture – Mist	½ yard	• Cut two 4 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 4 1/8" squares.
(G)	MC6305-Mist Confetti Border – Mist	1 ¼ yards	• Cut four 4 ½" x 30 ½" strips. • Cut four 4 ½" x 34 ½" strips.
Back	ing MC3744-Mist Quarter Dot – Mist	4 yards	Cut two 68" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 84" pieced backing.

#### You will also need:

• 68" x 84" batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, rotary cutter and mat.

While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original guilt.


#### **Block Assembly**

NOTE: You will need to pay attention to Fabric B and E while assembling. These are directional prints and need to be rotated for each position in the block. The direction of the fabric is represented by the zig zag line.

1. Place one 4 1/8" Fabric D square on top of one 4 1/8" Fabric E square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left (Fig. 1). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make two left D/E units. (Fig. 3). Trim left D/E units to measure 4 ½" square. Repeat to make twelve left D/E units total.





2. Place one 4 1/4" Fabric D square on top of one 4 1/4" Fabric E square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper left corner to the lower right (Fig. 4). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 5) to make two right D/E units. (Fig. 6). Trim right D/E units to measure 4 ½" square. Repeat to make twelve right D/E units total.







3. Place one 4 ½" Fabric B square on the left side of one 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 8). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.





Place another 4 ½" Fabric B square on the right side 4. of the 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 10). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to

complete one B/C/B unit.






- 5. Refer to Figure 10 for fabric direction and repeat Steps 3-4 to make twenty-four B/C/B units.
- 6. Repeat Steps 3-4 using twenty-four 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric B strips and forty-eight 2 ½" Fabric A squares to make twenty-four A/B/A units (Fig. 11).
- 7. Follow Figure 12 and sew one 4 ½" Fabric A square, four A/B/A units, four 2 ½" Fabric B squares, four B/C/B units, two left D/E units and two right D/E units together to make one Block One. Repeat to make six Block Ones total.



- 9. Repeat Step 2 using six 4 1/8" Fabric E squares and six 4 1/8" Fabric F squares to make twelve 4 1/2" right E/F units (Fig. 14).
- 10. Repeat Steps 3-4 using twenty-four 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strips and forty-eight 4 ½" Fabric A squares to make twenty-four A/C/A units (Fig. 15).
- 11. Repeat Steps 3-4 using twenty-four 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric A strips and forty-eight 2 ½" Fabric B squares to make twenty-four B/A/B units (Fig. 16).

12. Follow Figure 17 and sew one 4 ½" Fabric B square, four B/A/B units, four 2 ½" Fabric A squares, four A/C/A units, two left E/F units and two right E/F units to make one Block Two. Repeat to make six Block Twos total.









## Quilt Top Assembly (Follow the Quilt layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 13. Sew two Block Ones and one Block Two together, alternating them, to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
- 14. Sew two Block Twos and one Block One together, alternating them, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
- 15. Sew the four rows together, in numerical order, to make the quilt top.
- 16. Sew one 2 ½" x 64 ½" Fabric A strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 2 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric A strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 17. Sew two 4 ½" x 34 ½" Fabric G strips together, end to end, with the heavy confetti areas touching each other to make one side strip. Repeat to make a second side strip. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top.
- 18. Sew two 4 ½" x 30 ½" Fabric G strips together, end to end, with the heavy confetti areas touching each other, to make one strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 19. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 20. Sew the seven 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end-to-end with 45° seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press
- 21. Bind as desired.
