(A) SC5333 Indigo Cotton Couture	<p>4 yards total</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 1 1/4 yard (eight 5" x WOF strips) - 2 1/4 yards (thirteen 5 1/2" x WOF strips) - 1/2 yard (four 3 3/4" x WOF strips)
(B) SC5333 Gold Cotton Couture	<p>1 1/4 yards total</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - FQ (one 5 1/2" x WOF strip) - 1 yard (eight 3 3/4" x WOF strips)
(C) SC5333 Soft White Cotton Couture	<p>4 1/2 yards</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 1 5/8 yards (ten 5" x WOF strips), - 2 1/3 yards (fourteen 5 1/2" x WOF strips) - 1/3 yard (two 5" x WOF strips) - 1/2 yard (five 2 1/2" x WOF strips)
<p>(all measurements are given for "unfinished" squares/blocks, ie. with 1/4" seam allowance, unless specified)</p>

Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.

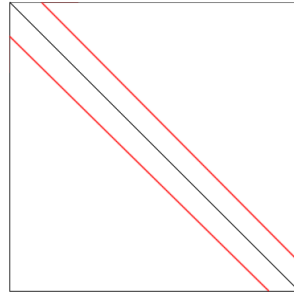
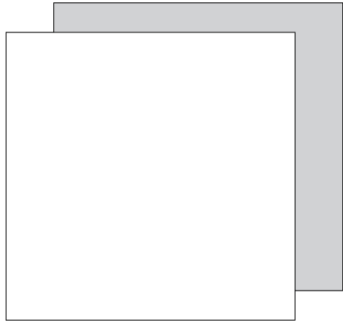
While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements, and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting, and or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

The Basics

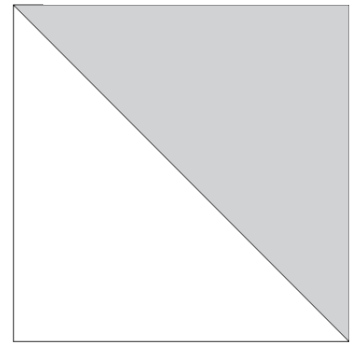
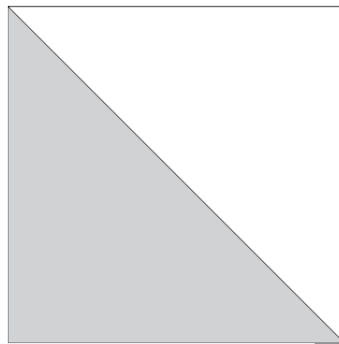
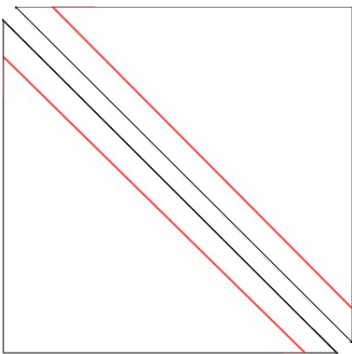
Instructions for two (2) HST blocks:

The unfinished HSTs are 5" and you will need to cut one 5½" square of each color needed in the HST.

1. Grab one square of each color and place right sides together. Draw a line on the back of the lighter fabric. Using the line as a guide, sew a 1/4" seam on BOTH sides of the line.



2. Cut along the middle line and press seam (pressing the seam toward the darker fabric)



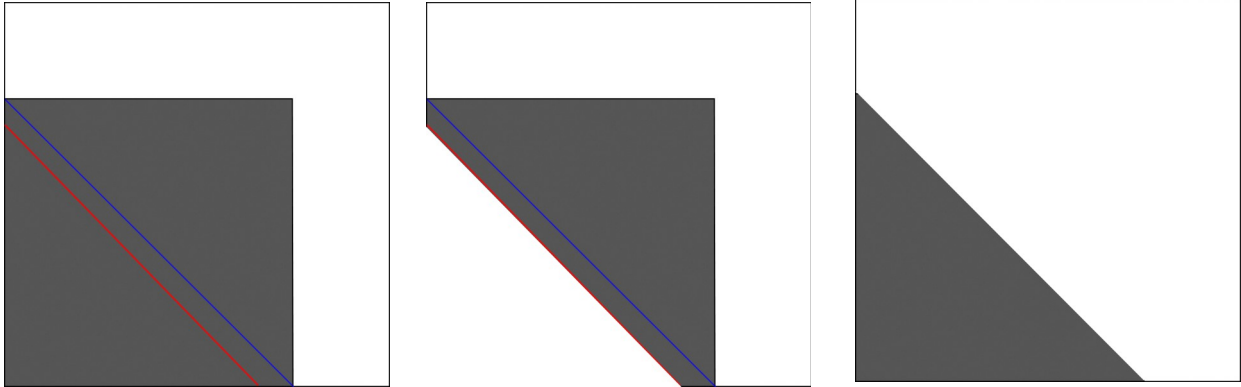
3. Trim the HSTs to 5"

You will need 12 HST blocks comprised of colors B and C (this will use 6 squares of both colors).

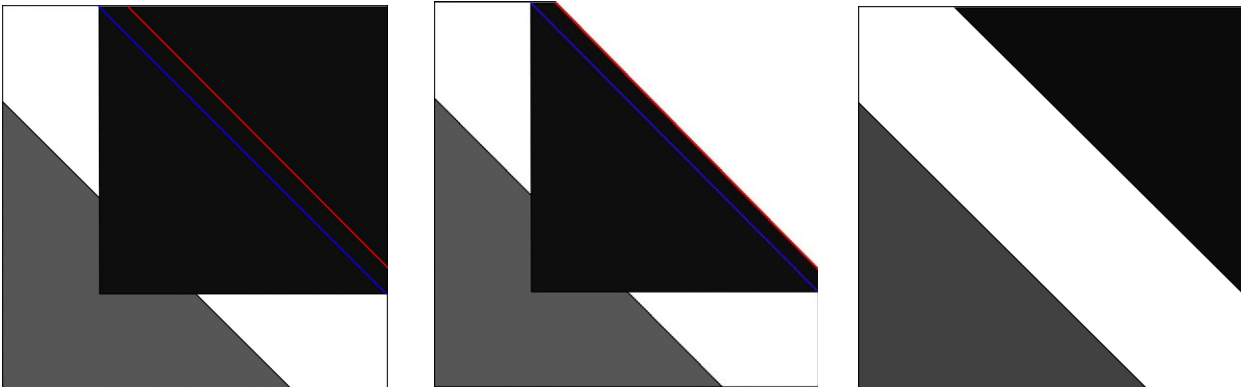
Instructions for Block 1:

The unfinished block is 5" and you will need to cut a 5" and a 3" triangle of color C and a 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " square of colors A and B. You will need 28 of these blocks.

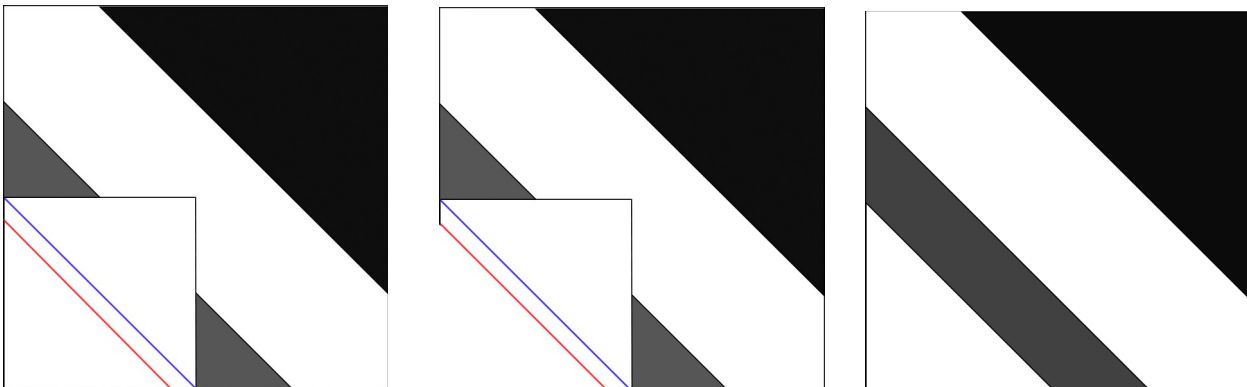
1. Place the larger square (color C) right side up. Place a 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " square of color B right side down on the larger square. Mark diagonally across the back of the smaller square and sew along this line (shown in blue). Cut 1/4" seam allowance (shown in red) on the outside of the line you just sewed on. Press the resultant flap flat.



2. Place a 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " square of color A in the opposite corner to the corner as color B and repeat step 1.



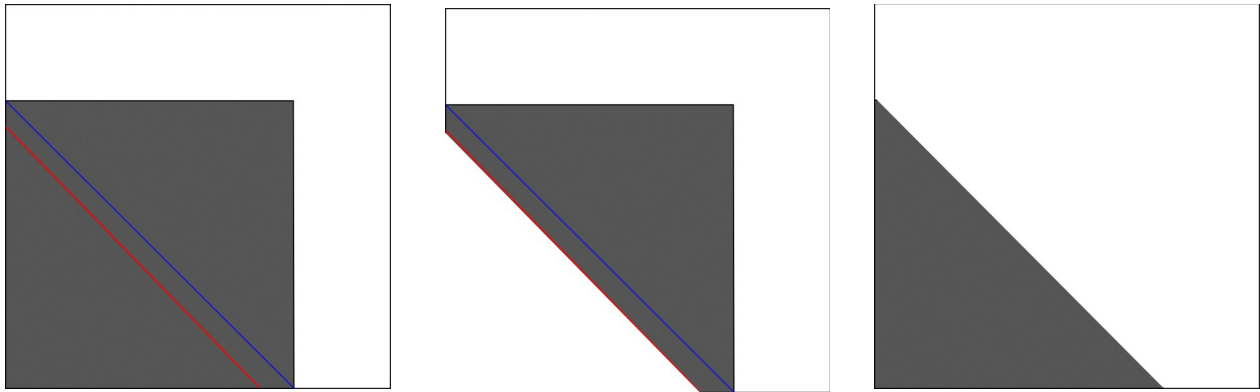
3. Place a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square of color C (right side down) over the triangle of color B and repeat step 1.



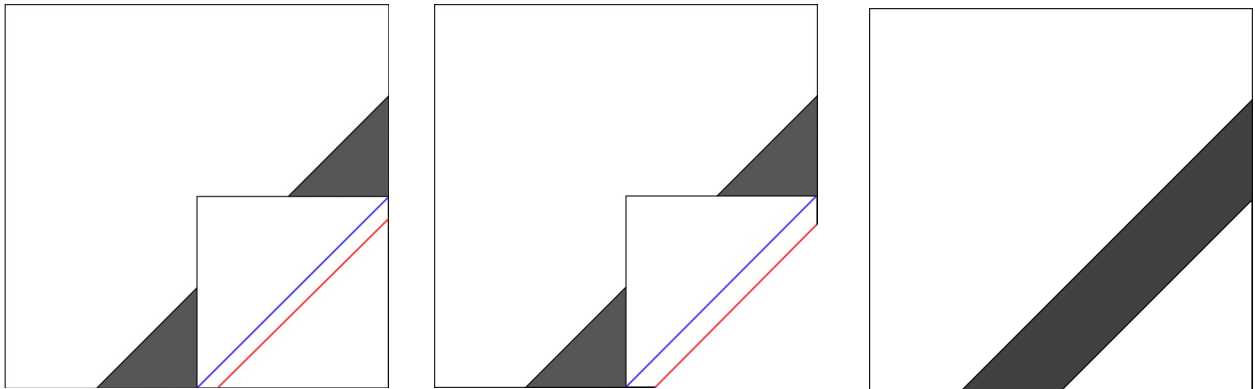
Instructions for two (2) Block 2 blocks:

The unfinished block is 5" and you will need to cut a 5½" square of colors A and C, two 4½" squares of color B and two 2¾" squares of color C. You will need 18 of this block, cut into two to make 36.

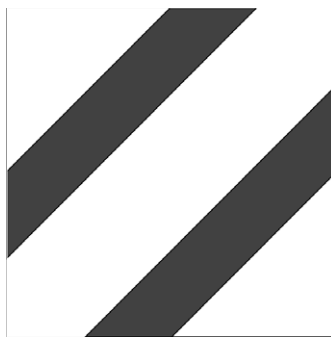
1. Place the 5½" square of color C right side up. Place a 4½" square of color B right side down on the larger square. Mark diagonally across the back of the smaller square and sew along this line (shown in blue). Cut ¼" seam allowance (shown in red) on the outside of the line you just sewed on. Press the resultant flap flat.



2. Place a 2¾" square of color C (right side down) over the triangle of color B and repeat step 1.

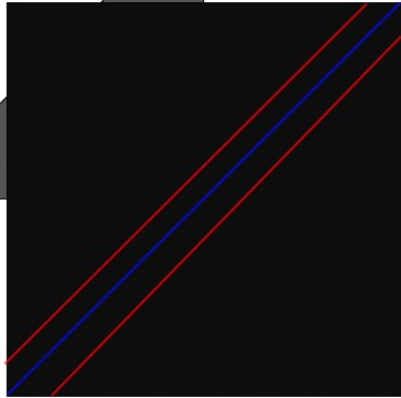
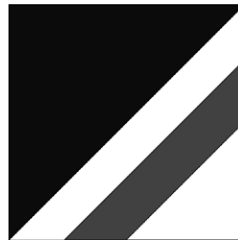
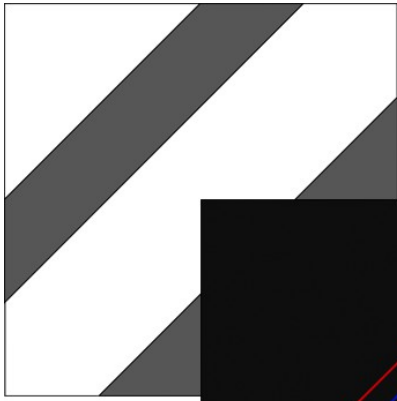


3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 on the diagonally opposite corners to create this block:



4. Grab a 5½" square of color A marked as you would with an HST block and place right sides together with the block you have created so far. Follow the instructions of creating HSTs. Make

sure the line on the square is facing the same direction as the 'lines' of the block it is paired with.

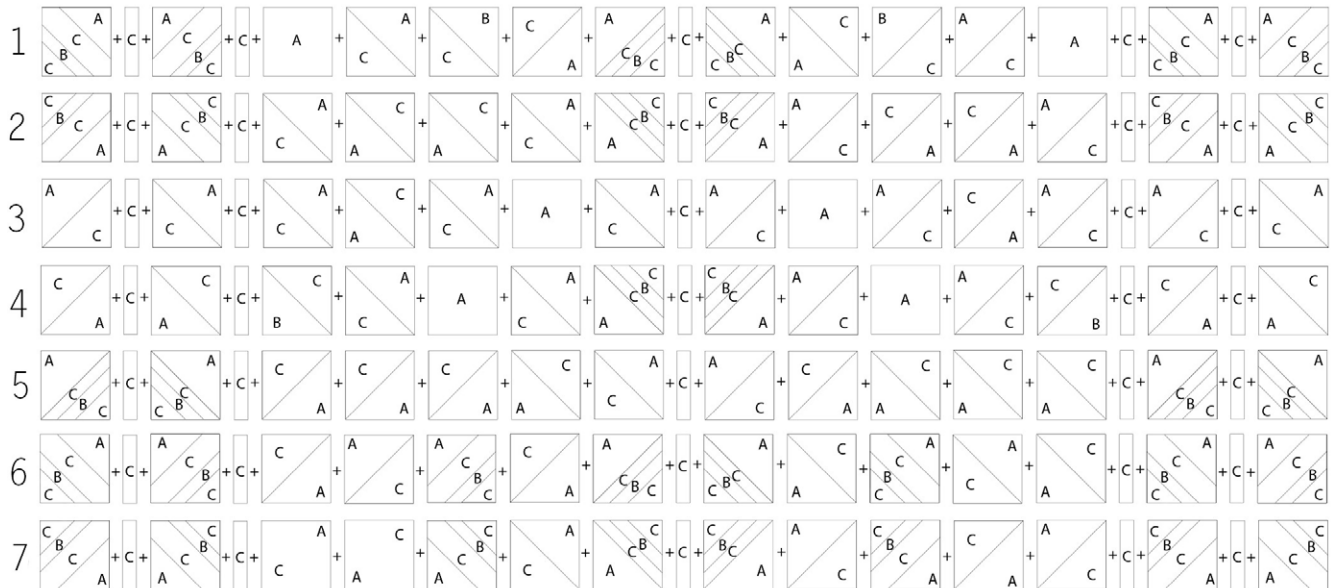


Assembling the quilt

For demonstrative purposes, I have labelled and not colored the plan (so you can color-in to help visualize your quilt).

STEP 1:

Assemble the following seven rows:



You will need to piece:

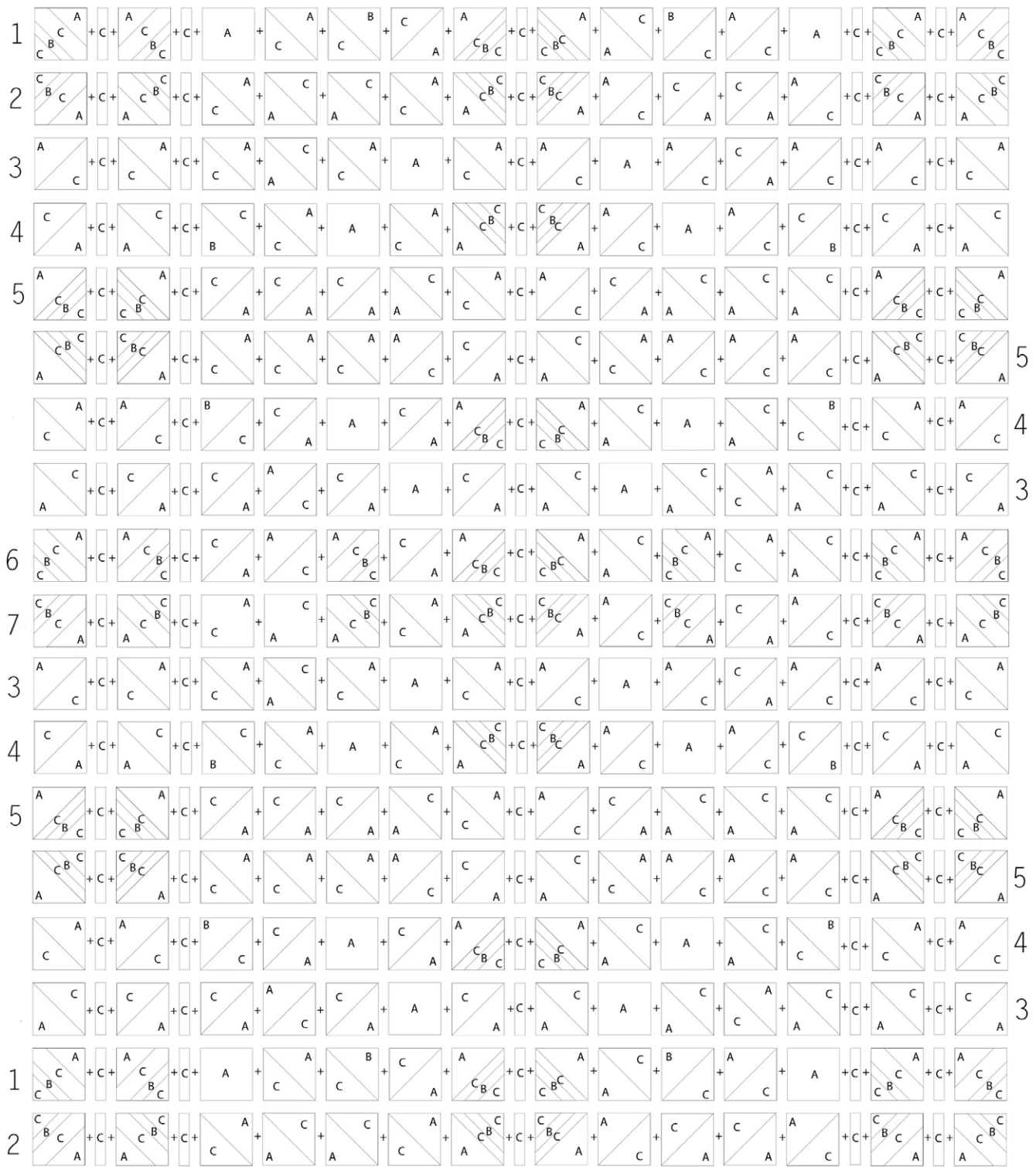
- two (2x) of rows 1 and 2
- four (4x) of rows 3, 4 and 5
- one (1x) of rows 6 and 7

STEP 2:

Assemble all 18 rows in the following order:

- 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5
- rotate rows 5, 4 and 3 180°
- 6,7,3,4,5,
- rotate rows 5, 4 and 3 180°
- 1 and 2

as illustrated on the following page.
