

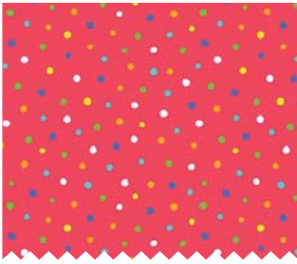

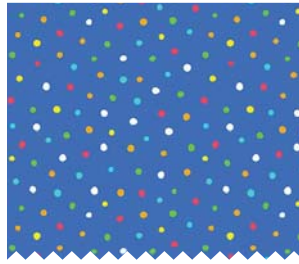




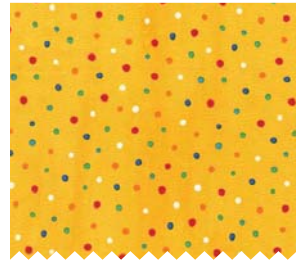

## "Creepy Crawlies"

Size: Approximately 48" x 56" Skill Level: Advanced Beginner

### Materials

#### Cutting instructions

**Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.**

	Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
(A)	CX4373-Red Dot Frolic – Red	1/3 yard	• Cut two 3 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut fourteen 3 7/8" squares.
(B)	CX4373-Royal Dot Frolic – Royal	1/2 yard	• Cut three 3 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut twenty-eight 3 7/8" squares.
(C)	CX4373-Yellow Dot Frolic – Yellow	1/3 yard	• Cut two 3 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut fourteen 3 7/8" squares.
(D)	CX7149-Black Flight Path – Black	7/8 yard	• Cut four 2 1/2" x 42 1/2" WOF strips. • Cut three 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 2 1/2" x 52 1/2" strips. • Cut three 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 2 1/2" x 48 1/2" strips.
(E)	SC5333-Green Cotton Couture – Green	1/3 yard	• Cut three 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" strips. • Cut three 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 1 1/2" x 44 1/2" strips.
(F)	SC5333-Caribbean Cotton Couture – Caribbean	7/8 yard	• Cut five 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eighteen 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips. • Cut one 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut eight 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips. • Cut two 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut seven 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips. • Cut four 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut ninety 1 1/2" squares.
(G)	CX7147-White Pesky – White	1/4 yard	• Cut one 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut three 6 1/2" squares.
(H)	CX4373-Black Dot Frolic – Black	5/8 yard	• Cut two 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut fifteen 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips. • Cut six 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.
(I)	CX7148-Green Scaly – Green	1/4 yard	• Cut one 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut two 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.
(J)	CX7150-Yellow Slithery – Yellow	1/4 yard	• Cut one 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into five 6 1/2" squares.
(K)	CX7148-Orange Scaly – Orange	1/4 yard	• Cut one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip.
(L)	CX7148-Navy Scaly – Navy	1/4 yard	• Cut one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip.
(M)	CX7147-Black Pesky-Black	1/4 yard	• Cut one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip.
(N)	CX7150-Royal Slithery – Royal	1/4 yard	• Cut one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip.
(O)	CX7150-Red Slithery – Red	1/4 yard	• Cut one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip.
Backing	CX7147-White Pesky – White	3 1/4 yards	• Cut two 56" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together and trim to make the 56" x 64" pieced backing.

#### You will also need:

• 56" x 64" batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, rotary cutter and mat.

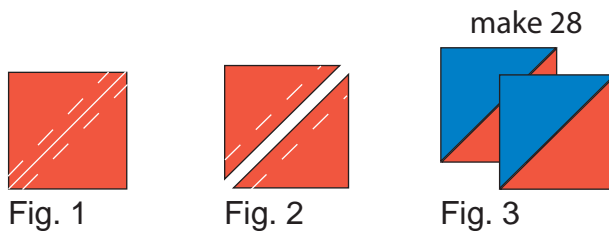

Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.

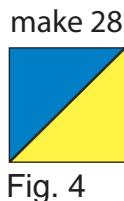
While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

## Block Assembly

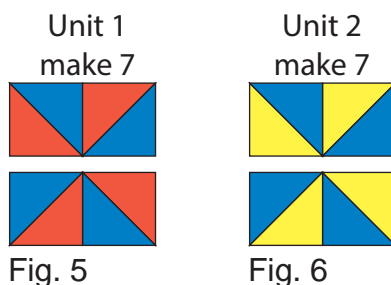
1. Place one  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric A square on top of one  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric B square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make two AB units (Fig. 3). Trim the AB units to measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make twenty-eight  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " AB units total.



2. Repeat Step 1 using fourteen  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric B squares and fourteen  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C squares to make twenty-eight  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " BC units (fig. 4).



3. Sew four AB units together to make one Unit 1 (Fig. 5). Repeat to make seven Unit 1's total.
4. Sew four BC units together to make one Unit 2 (Fig. 6). Repeat to make seven Unit 2's total.



5. Place one 1 ½" Fabric F square on the top left corner of one 6 ½" Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 8). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.
6. Follow Figure 9 for the seam direction to add a 1 ½" Fabric F square to each of the remaining corners of the 6 ½" Fabric G square to make one G block (Fig. 10).
7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make three G blocks total.

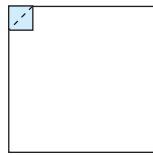

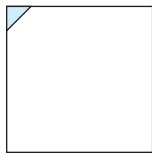

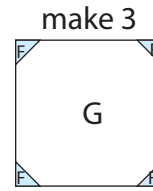

8. Repeat Steps 5-6 using five 6 ½" Fabric J squares and twenty 1 ½" Fabric F squares to make five J blocks (Fig. 11).

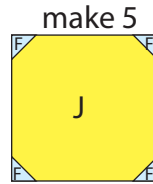

9. Place one 1 ½" Fabric F square on the top left corner of one 6 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric I strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.
10. Follow Figure 12 for the seam direction to add a 1 ½" Fabric F square to each of the remaining corners of the 6 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric I strip to make one I block.
11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make a second I Block.

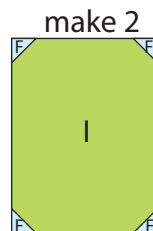

12. Repeat Steps 9-10 using one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric K strip and four 1 1/2" Fabric F squares to make one K block (Fig. 13).
13. Repeat Steps 9-10 using one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric L strip and four 1 1/2" Fabric F squares to make one L block (Fig. 14).
14. Repeat Steps 9-10 using one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric M strip and four 1 1/2" Fabric F squares to make one M block (Fig. 15).
15. Repeat Steps 9-10 using one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric N strip and four 1 1/2" Fabric F squares to make one N block (Fig. 16).
16. Repeat Steps 9-10 using one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric O strip and four 1 1/2" Fabric F squares to make one O block (Fig. 17).

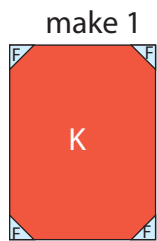

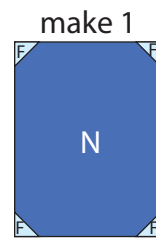

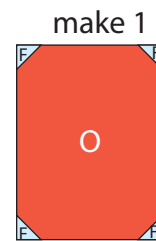

17. Sew one 1 1/2" Fabric F square to each end of one 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric H strip to make one Unit 3 (Fig. 18). Repeat to make fifteen Unit 3's total.

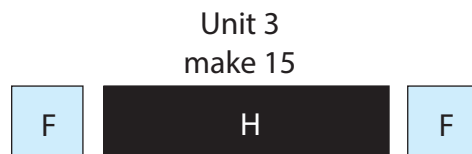

18. Follow Figure 19 and sew one Unit 3 to the top of one G block. Sew one 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the Unit 3 to make one G Jar (Fig. 19). Repeat to make three G Jars total.
19. Follow Figure 19 and sew one Unit 3 to the top of one J block. Sew one 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the Unit 3 to make one J Jar (Fig. 19). Repeat to make five J Jars total.

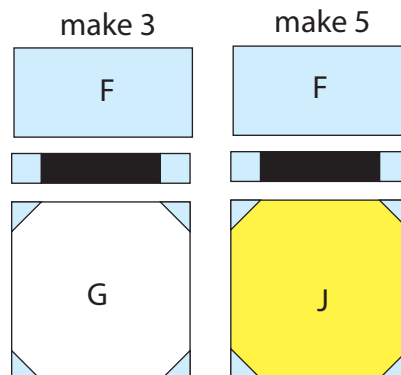

20. Sew one Unit 3 to the top of one I block. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the Unit 3 to make one I Jar (Fig. 20). Repeat to make a second I Jar.
21. Sew one Unit 3 to the top of one K block. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the Unit 3 to make one K Jar (Fig. 20).
22. Sew one Unit 3 to the top of one L block. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the Unit 3 to make one L Jar (Fig. 20).
23. Sew one Unit 3 to the top of one M block. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the Unit 3 to make one M Jar (Fig. 20).
24. Sew one Unit 3 to the top of one N block. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the Unit 3 to make one N Jar (Fig. 20).
25. Sew one Unit 3 to the top of one O block. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top of the Unit 3 to make one O Jar (Fig. 20).

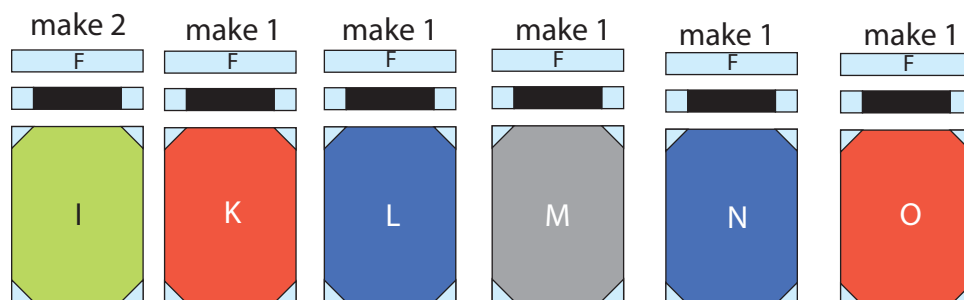
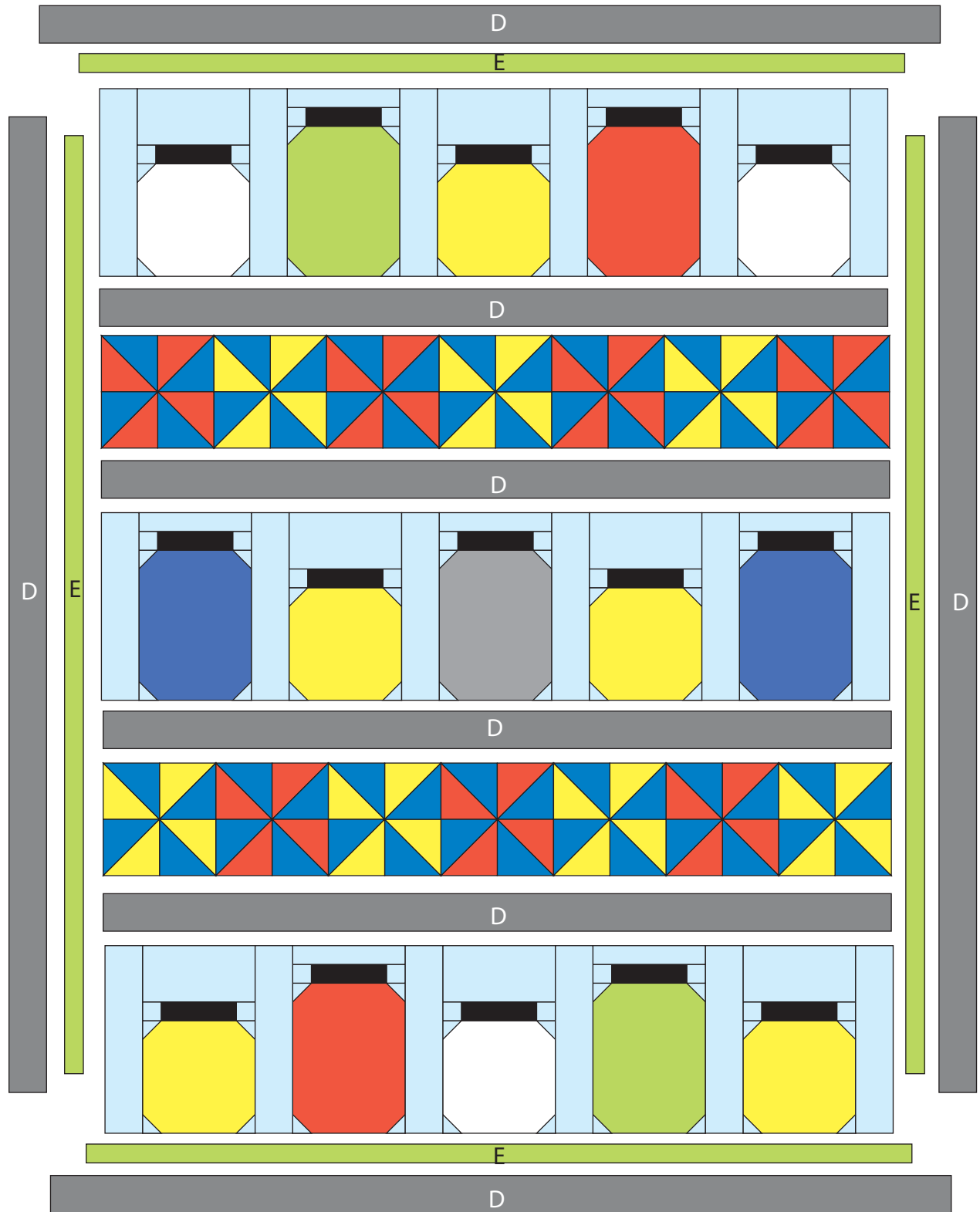

### Quilt Top Assembly

**(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)**

26. Sew six 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" Fabric F strips and five Jars together lengthwise to make Row One. Repeat to make Rows Three and Five.
27. Sew four Unit 1's and three Unit 2's together, alternating them, to make one strip. Sew one 2 1/2" x 42 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the strip to make Row Two.
28. Sew four Unit 2's and three Unit 1's together, alternating them, to make one strip. Sew one 2 1/2" x 42 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the strip to make Row Four.
29. Sew the five rows together in numerical order to make the quilt top.
30. Sew one 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" Fabric E strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1 1/2" x 44 1/2" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.
31. Sew one 2 1/2" x 52 1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 2 1/2" x 48 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.
32. Layer and quilt as desired.
33. Sew the six 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end-to-end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
34. Bind as desired.
