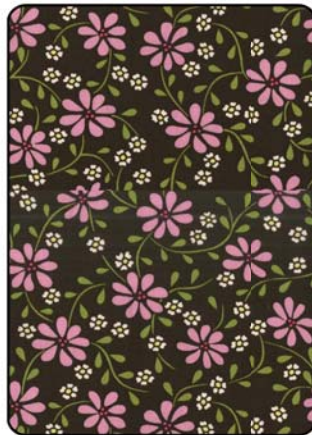

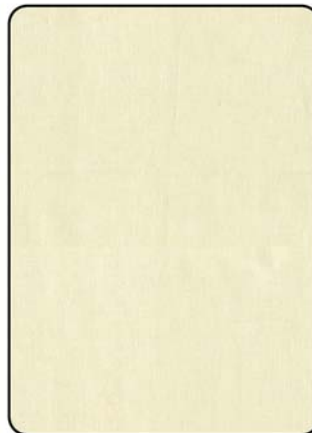

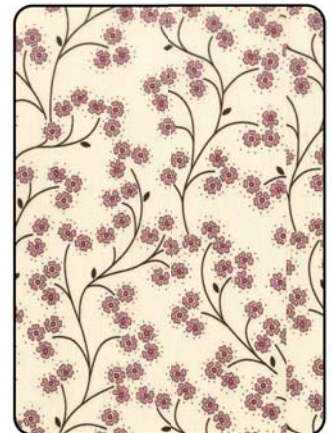

## "Wildflower Garden"

Size: Approximately 69" x 87" Skill Level: Intermediate

### Materials

#### Cutting instructions

**Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.**

	Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
(A)	CX7476-Primrose Garden Walk Mosaic – Primrose	¼ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut one 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into six 6 ½" squares.</li> </ul>
(B)	CX7474-Earth Mayapple – Earth	½ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut four 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into forty-eight 3 ½" squares.</li> </ul>
(C)	CX7478-Earth Sweet Everlasting – Earth	1 ⅛ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut two 4 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 4 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make forty-eight triangles.</li> <li>• Cut three 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 3 ⅞" squares.</li> <li>• Cut four 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.</li> </ul>
(D)	CX7473-Earth Prairie Rose – Earth	2 yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut two 12 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into six 12 ½" squares.</li> <li>• Cut four 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 5 ½" x 77 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut four 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 5 ½" x 69 ½" strips.</li> </ul>
(E)	CX7477-Earth Spring Beauty Stripe – Earth	1 ⅛ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut four 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twenty-four 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut eight 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.</li> </ul>
(F)	CX7478-Primrose Sweet Everlasting – Primrose	1 ⅓ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut five 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into forty-eight 3 ⅞" squares. Cut twenty-four of the squares across one diagonal to make forty-eight triangles.</li> <li>• Cut four 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into forty-eight 3 ½" squares.</li> <li>• Cut four 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 1 ½" x 75 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut three 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 1 ½" x 59 ½" strips.</li> </ul>
(G)	SC5333-Cream Cotton Couture – Cream	⅓ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut two 4 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into twelve 4 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make forty-eight triangles.</li> </ul>
(H)	CX7475-Primrose Meadow Sweet – Primrose	1 ½ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut five 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into forty-eight 3 ⅞" squares.</li> <li>• Cut eight 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into ninety-six 3 ½" squares.</li> </ul>
(I)	CX7477-Primrose Spring Beauty Stripe – Primrose	½ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut four 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 2" x 72 ½" strips.</li> <li>• Cut three 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 2" x 57 ½" strips.</li> </ul>
Backing	CX7473-Earth Prairie Rose – Earth	5 ⅓ yards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut two 95" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and cut a 77" x 95" piece for the backing.</li> </ul>

#### You will also need:

- 77" x 95" batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, rotary cutter and mat.

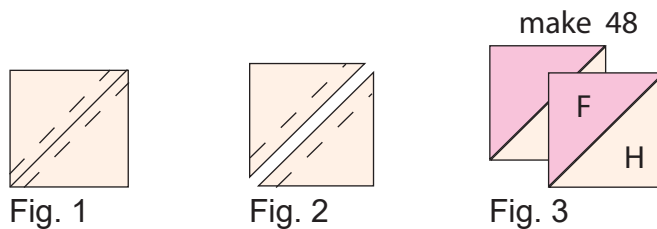

Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.

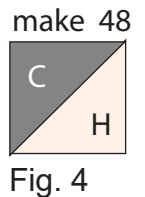
While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting, cutting or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

## Block Assembly

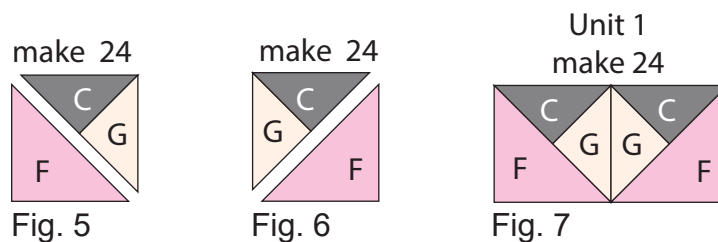
1. Place one  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric H square on top of one  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make two FH units (Fig. 3). Trim the FH units to measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Repeat to make forty-eight FH units total.



2. Repeat Step 1 using twenty-four  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C squares and twenty-four  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric H squares to make forty-eight  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " CH units (Fig. 4).



3. Sew one Fabric F triangle, one Fabric C triangle and one Fabric G triangle together to make one FCG unit (Fig. 5). Repeat to make twenty-four FCG units total.
4. Sew one Fabric G triangle, one Fabric C triangle and one Fabric F triangle together to make one GCF unit (Fig. 6). Repeat to make twenty-four GCF units total.
5. Sew one FCG unit and one GCF unit together, with the Fabric G triangles, touching to make one Unit 1 (Fig. 7). Repeat to make twenty-four Unit 1's total.



6. Place one 3 1/2" Fabric H square on the left side of one 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 9). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.
7. Place another 3 1/2" Fabric H square on the right side of the 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 11). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make one HCH unit. Repeat to make twenty-four HCH units total.
8. Repeat Steps 6-7 using forty-eight 3 1/2" Fabric H squares and twenty-four 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric E strips to make twenty-four HEH units (Fig. 12).

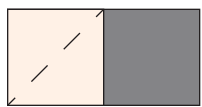

9. Sew two FH units and two 3 1/2" Fabric B squares together to make one Unit 2 (Fig. 13). Repeat to make twenty-four Unit 2's total.
10. Sew one HCH unit to the top of one Unit 1 lengthwise to make one Unit 3 (Fig. 14). Repeat to make twenty-four Unit 3's total.
11. Sew one Unit 3 to each side of one 6 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew one Unit 2 to each end of one Unit 3. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make one Block One (Fig. 15). Repeat to make six Block Ones total.

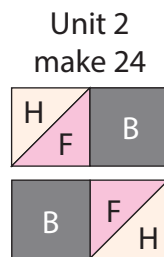

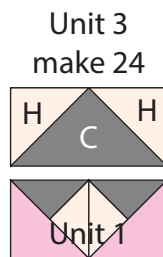

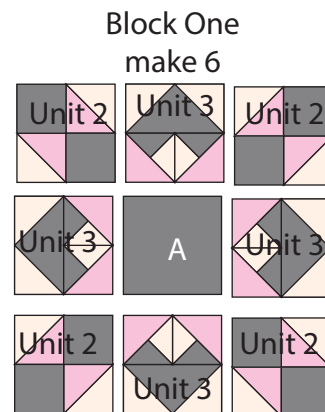

12. Sew one CH unit to each end of one HEH unit to make one Unit 4 (Fig. 16). Repeat to make twenty-four Unit 4's total.

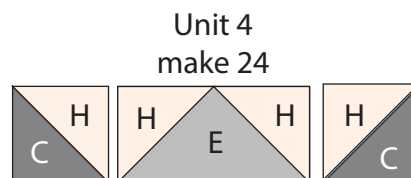

13. Place one 3 ½" Fabric F square on the top left corner of one 12 ½" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 17). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 17). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 18). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.
14. Follow Figure 19 for the seam direction to add a 3 ½" Fabric F square to each of the remaining corners of the 12 ½" Fabric D square to make one Unit 5 (Fig. 20).
15. Repeat Steps 13-14 to make six Unit 5's total.

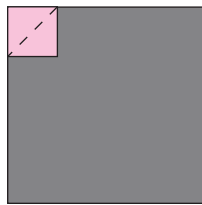

16. Sew one unit four to each side of one Unit 5. Sew one 3 ½" Fabric F square to each end of one Unit 4. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 5 to make one Block Two (Fig. 21). Repeat to make six Block Twos total.

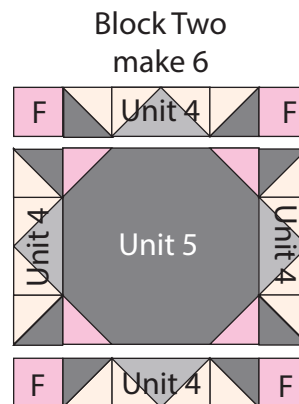


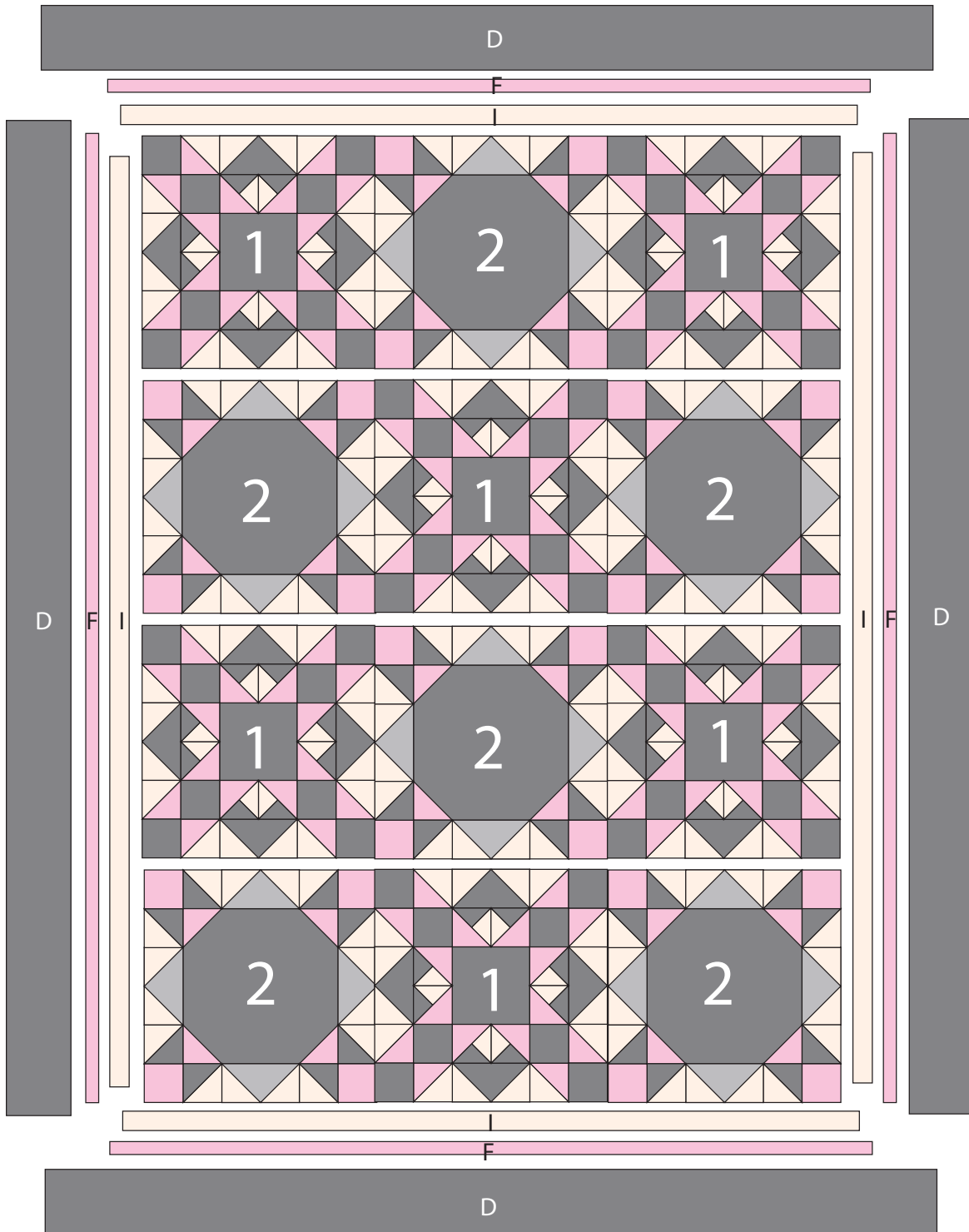

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

17. Sew one Block One to each side of one Block Two to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
18. Sew one Block Two to each side of one Block One to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
19. Sew the four rows together in numerical order to make the Center Block.
20. Sew one 2" x 72 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 2" x 57 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
21. Sew one 1 ½" x 75 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 1 ½" x 59 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

22. Sew one 5 1/2" x 77 1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 5 1/2" x 69 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
23. Layer and quilt as desired.
24. Sew the eight 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric E strips together, end-to-end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press
25. Bind as desired.
