

A	 a. pieced blocks (15) 2" x wof. Subcut (300) 2" x 2" squares. (22) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (150) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares. b. patch blocks (2) 2 3/4" x wof. Subcut (8) 2 3/4" x 9 1/2" rectangles. (7) 5" x wof. Subcut (26) 5" x 9 1/2" rectangles.
В	a. pieced blocks (2) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (8) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
С	a. pieced blocks (1) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (7) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
D	a. pieced blocks (1) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (7) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
Е	a. pieced blocks (2) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (8) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
F	 a. pieced blocks (2) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (8) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares. b. binding (9) 2 1/4" x wof. Piece strips to make a continuous binding strip.
G	a. pieced blocks (1) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (4) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
Н	a. pieced blocks (3) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (18) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
I	a. pieced blocks (1) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (7) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
J	a. pieced blocks (3) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (16) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.



K	a. pieced blocks (2) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (9) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
L	a. pieced blocks (2) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (9) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.

M	a. pieced blocks (3) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (15) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
N	a. pieced blocks (2) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (9) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
0	a. pieced blocks (2) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (9) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.
Р	a. pieced blocks (3) 5 1/2" x wof. Subcut (16) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" squares.



Constructing pieced blocks

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" Fabric A square. Place square, right sides together, on (1) 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" print square. Sew 1/4" away from, on right and left sides of drawn line. Cut along drawn line. Open and press to yield (2) HST units.



Align diagonal seams of HST unit against the 45 degree line on quilting ruler, trim unit to measure 5" x 5" raw edge to raw edge.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) 2" x 2" Fabric A square. Place square, right sides together, at the bottom right corner of the HST unit where the print fabric patch is. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal Fabric A corner triangle.



Repeat to make a mirror-imaged unit.



Sew together both units to complete (1) block.



2. Make a total number of blocks for each of the following prints:

18 blocks: Fabric H 16 blocks: Fabric J, P 15 blocks: Fabric M

9 blocks: Fabric K, L, N, O 8 blocks: Fabrics B, E, F 7 blocks: Fabrics C, D, I 4 blocks: Fabric G



Quilt Top Assembly


1. Pieced columns. Refer to quilt image for guide on block placement and orientation, arrange and sew together pieced blocks, patch blocks (where appropriate) to make a pieced column. Make a total of (9) pieced columns.

For example:

Column 1: (17) pieced blocks and (3) 5" x 9 1/2" Fabric A patch blocks.

Column 2: (16) pieced blocks, (3) 5" x 9 1/2" Fabric A patch blocks, and (2) 2 3/4" x 9 1/2" Fabric A patch blocks.

Column 1 is shown below.





Finishing

- 1. With the backing fabric laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form quilt sandwich. Baste sandwich.
- 2. Quilt as desired.
- 3. Bind to finish quilt.
