Optional: Quilt In A Day® Mini Flying Geese Ruler Set #2020

1/4" Seam Allowance Check


Even if you use a 1/4" foot, your seam allowance may not be The center piece should be **exactly** 1" wide. accurate!

To check if your seam is accurate, cut three 1 1/2" x 3" pieces from scrap fabric.

Sew the pieces together along the 3" side, using what you believe is a 1/4" seam.

Press away from the center piece.

Measure.



If, when you measure, the center is less than 1", your seam allowance is too large.

If it's more than 1", your seam allowance is too small.

Refer to your machine owner's manual for instructions on changing your needle position.

Repeat the test until your center strip measures exactly 1".

* For Flying Geese, chose which method you wish to use and cut accordingly. DO NOT CUT BOTH

A	(4) 2½" x WOF strips. Subcut each strip: (1) 2½" x 20"; (1) 2½" x 21" (2) 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: (8) 2" x 8½"; (4) 2" squares (2) 2" x WOF strips. Subcut: (2) 2" x 35½"(8) 2" x WOF strips.

С	(5) 2" x WOF strips. (7) 2½" x WOF strips for binding
D	(1) 16½" x 20½" fussy cut (4) 8½" squares, fussy cut
E	(1) 2½" x WOF strip. Subcut: (8) 2½" x 4½" (2) 2½" x WOF strips. Subcut: (8) 2½" x 6½" (1) 4½" x WOF strip. Subcut: (4) 4½" x 5½" (1) 2½" x WOF strip. Subcut: (16) 2½" squares

Make the following flying geese units: fabric G/fabric H - make 16 flying geese units

Flying Geese (No-Waste method)

Use the technique sheet on page 9 to make flying geese units. Trim to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Flying Geese (Quilt In A Day Ruler method)

Follow the instructions included with the ruler to make *finished* 2" x 4" flying geese units.

All Methods:

Stitch the geese units together in pairs as shown. Square units to $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". Stitch four units together as shown. Square blocks to $8\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make four blocks.




Flying Geese:

Make the following flying geese units using the method you chose:

fabric E/fabric F - make 36 dark flying geese units



fabric E/fabric G - make 32 medium flying geese units





Trim units to 21/2" x 41/2".



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Assembly:

Stitch one dark and one medium flying geese unit together as shown. Add one fabric E $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to each side as shown. Square to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make four blocks.



Stitch two blocks to one fabric D $8\frac{1}{2}$ " square as shown. Trim to $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make two blocks.





Stitch one dark, one medium, and one light flying geese unit together as shown. Add one fabric E $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to each side. Square to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make four blocks.



Stitch two blocks to each of the remaining fabric D $8\frac{1}{2}$ " squares as shown. Trim to $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make two blocks.





Stitch one fabric A $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the left and right sides of the fabric D $16\frac{1}{2}$ " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ " panel block. Stitch one fabric A $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21" strip to the top and bottom. Trim to $19\frac{1}{2}$ " x $23\frac{1}{2}$ ", centering panel.





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Stitch one fabric A 2" x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the sides of the top and bottom blocks.

Add to panel block as shown.







Combine the pieced blocks, the side blocks and four fabric A $2" \times 8\frac{1}{2}"$ rectangles as shown. Add to the sides of the quilt.



Borders:

Stitch eight fabric A 2" x WOF strips together end-to-end, after removing selvedge edge. Cut the following:

- (2) 2" x 421/2"
- (2) 2" x 521/2"
- (2) 2" x 53½"

Stitch one fabric A 2" x 35½" strip to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Stitch one fabric A 2" x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the left and right sides of the quilt.

Stitch one fabric C 2" x $38\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Stitch three fabric C 2" x WOF strips together, end-to-end, after removing selvedge edge. Cut into (2) 2" x 42½" strips. Add one fabric A 2" square to each end of each strip. Add to the sides of the quilt.



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Cornerstones:

Draw a diagonal line on four fabric E 21/2" squares.

Place one square on the corner of one fabric I 41/2" square. Stitch on the drawn line.

Cut away excess, leaving a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance. Press triangle outward. Repeat on the remaining three corners. Square block to $\frac{4}{2}$ ". Make four blocks.

Use the border assembly diagram to combine the flying geese units, cornerstones, and four fabric E $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles to complete the pieced border.





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Stitch one fabric A 2" x $53\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the left and right sides of the quilt.

Stitch one fabric A 2" x $52\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Stitch eight fabric B $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips together in pairs. Add to the quilt mitering corners.

Finishing:

Layer, baste and quilt as desired.

Bind with seven fabric C 21/2" x WOF strips.




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
No-Waste Flying Geese

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the smaller squares.


Add two smaller squares to one larger square, right sides together, as shown.



Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.





Cut on the drawn line and press small triangles outward.



Add one small square, right sides together, as shown.

Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.





Each set of one large square and four small squares makes four flying geese units.
