## Cutting instructions

Please Note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

| Fabric |  | Yardage | Cutting |

| (A) | CX7168-Summer Blooming Border - Summer | $17 / 8$ yards | -Fussy cut two $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 63$ " length of fabric (LOF) strips, each centered on the border flowers. Trim the strip to measure $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. <br> From the remaining fabric: <br> - Cut seven $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 17^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 501 / 2$ " strips. <br> - Cut seven $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 17^{\prime \prime}$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 521 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> - Cut eight $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 17$ " WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 631 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. |
| (B) | CX7167-Navy <br> Bloomers - Navy | $11 / 2$ yards | - Fussy cut one $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ LOF strip. <br> - Cut four $31 / 2 "$ squares. |
| (C) | SC5333-Midnight Cotton Couture - Midnight | $1 / 2$ yard | - Cut two $61 / 4 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into eight $61 / 4 "$ squares. |
| (D) | CX7172-Cornflower Pom Poms - Cornflower | $1 / 2$ yard | - Cut two $61 / 4 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into eight $61 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares. |
| (E) | $\begin{aligned} & \text { SC5333-Sun } \\ & \text { Cotton Couture - Sun } \end{aligned}$ | 1/4 yard | - Cut one $61 / 4 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into six $61 / 4 "$ squares. |
| (F) | CX7171-Sky Breezy Blooms - Sky | 1/4 yard | - Cut one $61 / 4 "$ x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into six $61 / 4 "$ squares. |
| (G) | SC5333-Lipstick Cotton Couture - Lipstick | 1/4 yard | - Cut one $61 / 4 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into six $61 / 4 "$ squares. |
| (H) | CX7172-Coral Pom Poms - Coral | 1/4 yard | - Cut one $61 / 4 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into six $61 / 4 "$ squares. |
| (I) | CX5514-Navy <br> Pin Dots - Navy | $11 / 2$ yards | - Cut nine 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut six 2 " x $501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> - Cut four $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 61 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips. <br> - Cut three $1 \frac{1}{2}{ }^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 521 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> - Cut seven $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for the binding. |
| Back | CX7167-Summer  <br>  Bloomers - Summer | $33 / 4$ yards | - Cut two 66 " $\times$ WOF strips. Piece the strips together and trim to make the 66 " $\times 77^{\prime \prime}$ pieced backing. |

## You will also need:

- 66 " $\times 77$ " batting, threads to match, scissors, straight pins, acrylic ruler, rotary cutter and mat.

Yardage requirements for this pattern may allow for excess yardage to accommodate specific placement of motifs or to allow for any fussy-cutting to achieve the finished quilt design.

While every attempt has been made to give accurate measurements, yardage requirements and construction directions; this does not allow personal variations in measuring, cutting or sewing. The enclosed directions were used in the construction of the original quilt.

## Block Assembly

1. Place one $61 / 4 "$ Fabric D square on top of one $61 / 4$ " Fabric C square, right side together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make two half-square triangles (Fig. 3). Trim the blocks to measure $57 / 8 "$ square.

2. Place one half-square triangle from Step 1 on top of another half-square triangle, right sides together. Make sure the center seam is going in the same direction on both half-square triangles and the Fabric D Triangle in the top block is opposite from the Fabric D triangle in the bottom block (Fig. 4).

3. Draw a diagonal line across the top half-square triangle so that it goes through the sewn seam. Sew $1 / 4$ " away from both sides of the drawn line (Fig. 5). Cut on the drawn line to make two Unit 1's (Fig. 6). Trim the units to measure $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square.
4. Repeat Steps 1-3 to make sixteen Unit 1's total.

5. Repeat Steps $1-3$ using six $61 / 4$ " Fabric F squares and six $61 / 4$ " Fabric E squares to make twelve $51 / 2$ " Unit 2's (Fig. 7).
6. Repeat Steps $1-3$ using six $61 / 4$ " Fabric H squares and six $61 / 4$ " Fabric G squares to make twelve $51 / 2$ " Unit 3's (Fig. 8).

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
7. Sew four Unit 1's, three Unit 2's and three Unit 3's together to make one sashing strip. Repeat to make four sashing strips total. Pay attention to the order of the Units as it is differs from row to row.
8. Sew one 2" $\times 501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of one $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip lengthwise to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
9. Sew one $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of one $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 501 / 2$ " Fabric B strip lengthwise. Sew one 2" x $501 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric B/Fabric A strip lengthwise to make Row Two.
10. Sew the four sashing strips and three rows, in numerical order, together alternating them, to make the quilt top.
11. Sew one $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 61 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 521 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.
12. Sew one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 631 / 2$ " Fabric A strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square to each end of one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 521 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.
13. Layer and quilt as desired.
14. Sew the seven $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric I strips together, end-to-end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
15. Bind as desired.
