


KEY	CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS
Α	Centered on blocks, fussy cut (8) 8-1/2" squares.
В	(1) 8-1/2" x Width of Fabric (WOF) strip, sub-cut (16) 8-1/2" x 2" strips. (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 2" x 11-1/2" strips.
С	(4) 2" x WOF strips, sew short ends together. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 63-1/2" strips. (3) 2" x WOF strips, sew short ends together. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 51-1/2" strips. (6) 1-1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" strips. (8) 1-1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" strips.
D	(4) 4-1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 4-1/2" squares. (2) 3-1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 3-1/2" squares. FOR BINDING: (7) 2-1/2" x WOF strips, sew short ends together.
E	(3) 2-1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2-1/2" squares. (21) 1" x WOF strips, sub-cut (62) 1" x 12-1/2" strips.
F	(11) 2-1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (31) 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" strips.
G	(4) 2-1/2" x WOF strips, sew short ends together. Sub-cut (2) 2-1/2" x 66-1/2" strips. (3) 2-1/2" x WOF strips, sew short ends together. Sub-cut (2) 2-1/2" x 55-1/2" strips.
Н	Centered on a row of sunflowers, fussy cut (2) 4-1/2" x 82" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips. Centered on a row of sunflowers, fussy cut (2) 4-1/2 x 67" LOF strips.
I	(1) 8-1/2" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 8-1/2" squares.
J	(2) 1-1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" strips. (2) 1-1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" strips.
Back	(2) 86" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together and trim to make the 71" x 86" pieced backing.
	Batting 71" x 86"




Note: The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.


Block Assembly

- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 8-1/2" Fabric **B** strip to each side of (1) 8-1/2" Fabric **A** square. Sew (1) 2" x 11-1/2" Fabric **B** strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric **A** square to make (1) 10-1/2" **Unit 1** square (Fig. 1). Trim the unit to measure 10-1/2" x 10-1/2". Repeat to make (8) **Unit 1** squares total.
- 2. Sew (1) 1-1/2" \times 8-1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric I square. Sew (1) 1-1/2" \times 10-1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I square to make (1) 10-1/2" Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 squares total.



- 3. Sew (1) 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (8) Unit 3 squares total.
- **4.** Sew (1) 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" Fabric **C** strip to each side of (1) **Unit 2** square. Sew (1) 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric **C** strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Unit 2** square to make (1) **Unit 4** square **(Fig. 4)**. Repeat to make (4) **Unit 4** squares total.
- **5.** Place (1) 4-1/2" Fabric **D** square on the top left corner of (1) **Unit 3** square, right sides together **(Fig. 5)**. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner **(Fig. 5)**. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam **(Fig. 6)**.









6. Follow Figure 7 for the seam direction to add a 4-1/2" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 8).










8. Place (1) 2-1/2" Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 5 square, right sides

together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 10).

- 9. Follow Figure 11 for the seam direction to add a 2-1/2" Fabric E square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 5 square to make (1) 12-1/2" Block One square (Fig. 12).
- 10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (8) Block One squares total.










11. Place (1) 2-1/2" Fabric **E** square on the top left corner of (1) **Unit 4** square, right sides together **(Fig. 13)**. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right


corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 13). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 14).

- 12. Follow Figure 15 for the seam direction to add a 2-1/2" Fabric E square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 4 square to make (1) 12-1/2" Block Two square (Fig. 16).
- 13. Repeat Steps 11-12 to make (4) Block Two squares total.

- 14. Sew (1) 1" x 12-1/2" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric **F** strip lengthwise to make (1) 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" Unit 6 strip (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (31) Unit 6 strips total.
- Unit 6 make 31

- 15. Sew together (4) 3-1/2" Fabric **D** squares and (3) **Unit 6** strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 18). Repeat to make **Row Three**, **Row Five**, **Row Seven** and Row Nine.
- 16. Sew together (4) Unit 6 strips and (3) Block **One** squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 18). Repeat to make Row Eight.
- 17. Sew together (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) Unit 6 strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Four (Fig. 18). Repeat to make Row Six.
- 18. Sew together the (9) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to the bottom, to make the 48-1/2" x 63-1/2" Center Block (Fig. 18).




Quilt Top Assembly:

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the guilt top.)

19. Sew (1) 2" x 63-1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51-1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 20. Sew (1) 2-1/2" x 66-1/2" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2-1/2" x 55-1/2" Fabric **G** strip to the top and to the bottom of the **Center Block**.
- 21. Center (1) 4-1/2" x 82" Fabric H strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.



- 22. Repeat Step 21 to sew (1) 4-1/2" x 67" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 19).
- **23.** Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in **Figure 19**), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



FINISHING:

- **24.** With the backing fabric laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form quilt sandwich. Baste sandwich.
- 25. Quilt as desired.
- 26. Bind to finish quilt.
