| B | (1) $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ Width of Fabric (WOF) strip, sub-cut (16) $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> (6) $2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (16) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. |
| C | (4) $2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sew short ends together. Sub-cut (2) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 63-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> (3) $2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sew short ends together. Sub-cut (2) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 51-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> (6) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (24) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> (8) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (24) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. |
| D | (4) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 4-1/2" squares. <br> (2) $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (20) $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares. <br> FOR BINDING: <br> (7) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sew short ends together. |
| E | (3) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2-1/2" squares. (21) $1^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (62) 1 " $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. |
| F | (11) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (31) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. |
| G | (4) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sew short ends together. Sub-cut (2) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 66-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> (3) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sew short ends together. Sub-cut (2) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 55-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. |
| H | Centered on a row of sunflowers, fussy cut (2) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 82^{\prime \prime}$ Length of Fabric (LOF) strips. Centered on a row of sunflowers, fussy cut (2) $4-1 / 2 \times 67^{\prime \prime}$ LOF strips. |
| I | (1) 8-1/2" $\times$ WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 8-1/2" squares. |
| J | (2) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (8) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. <br> (2) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, sub-cut (8) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. |
| Back | (2) 86 " $\times$ WOF strips. Piece the strips together and trim to make the $71^{\prime \prime} \times 86^{\prime \prime}$ pieced backing. |

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Note: The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

## Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2" $\times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ strip to each side of (1) $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{A}$ square. Sew
(1) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 11-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric $\mathbf{A}$ square to make (1) $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Trim the unit to measure $10-1 / \mathbf{2 " ~}^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat to make (8) Unit 1 squares total.
2. Sew (1) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strip to each side of (1) $8^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric I square. Sew (1) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $J$ strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I square to make (1) 10-1/2" Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 squares total.

3. Sew (1) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (8) Unit 3 squares total.
4. Sew (1) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 squares total.
5. Place (1) 4-1/2" Fabric $\mathbf{D}$ square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 3 square, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 6).

6. Follow Figure 7 for the seam direction to add a 4-1/2" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 8).
7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (8) Unit $\mathbf{5}$ squares total.

8. Place (1) $2-1 / 2$ " Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 5 square, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ away from the sewn seam (Fig. 10).
9. Follow Figure 11 for the seam direction to add a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 5 square to make (1) 12-1/2" Block One square (Fig. 12).
10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (8) Block One squares total.

11. Place (1) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 4 square, right sides together (Fig. 13). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 13). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ away from the sewn seam (Fig. 14).
12. Follow Figure 15 for the seam direction to add a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 4 square to make (1) 12-1/2" Block Two square (Fig. 16).
13. Repeat Steps 11-12 to make (4) Block Two squares total.

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14. Sew (1) 1 " $\times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{E}$ strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{F}$ strip lengthwise to make (1) $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Unit 6 strip (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (31) Unit 6 strips total.
15. Sew together (4) 3-1/2" Fabric D squares and

## Quilt Top Assembly:

## (Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)

19. Sew (1) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 63-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 51-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
20. Sew (1) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 66-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 55-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{G}$ strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
21. Center (1) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 82^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{H}$ strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.

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22. Repeat Step 21 to sew (1) 4-1/2" x 67" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides
(Fig. 19).
23. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 19), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

FINISHING:
24. With the backing fabric laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form quilt sandwich. Baste sandwich.
25. Quilt as desired.
26. Bind to finish quilt.
