

Bath Mitt

This bath mitt features fabric from the Michael Miller Fabrics Organic Collection.

OC3618_Natural Organic Terry

- 2 pieces measuring 9" x 7" for the back
- 2 pieces measuring 6" x 7" for the pocket

TR3603 Tan Organic Gingham Bias Trim

- 6" for across the pocket
- 22" for the perimeter

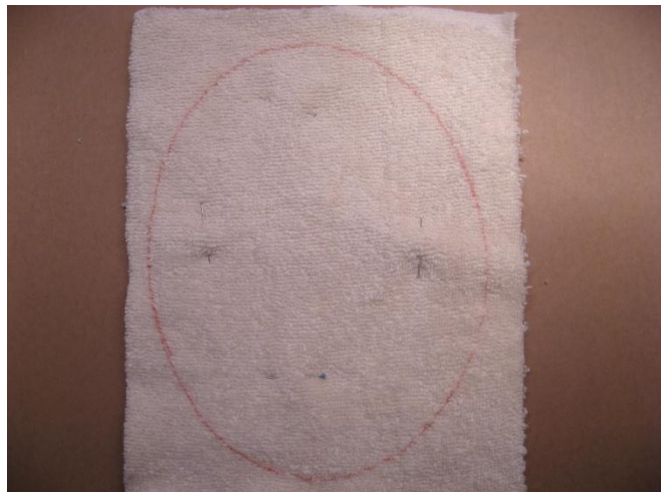
Also recommended: A sewing machine needle size 14 or above, since you will be sewing through many layers of fabric.

The pattern piece is on the last page of this tutorial.



Assemble the Back:

Place the two 9" x 7" pieces of terry cloth together with wrong sides facing (in other words, terry sides out). Place the pattern on the fabric and trace around it. Pin fabric in place.



Stitch directly on the line all the way around.



Trim the excess fabric, leaving about ¼” beyond the seam.

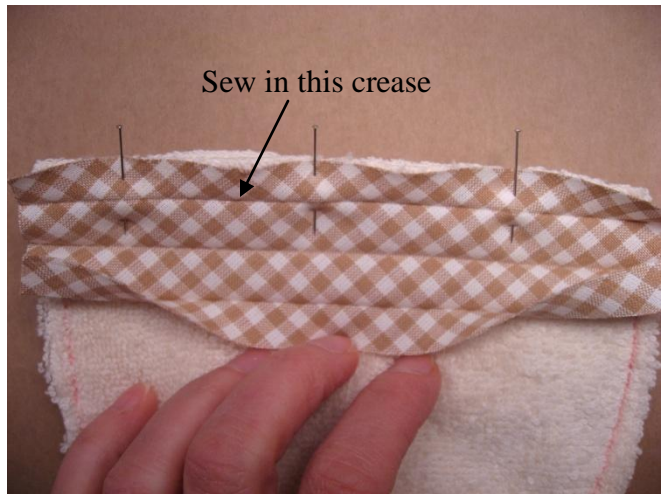


Create the Pocket:

Fold the pattern piece down on the line and use it to create the pocket using the same method as above.



Unfold the 6" piece of bias trim and pin it on the top of the pocket as shown. Attach it by sewing directly in the crease all the way across the top.



Fold the bias trim up and over the raw edge of the pocket and under again. Pin trim in place. Turn the pocket over and sew closely to the edge of the trim to attach it.



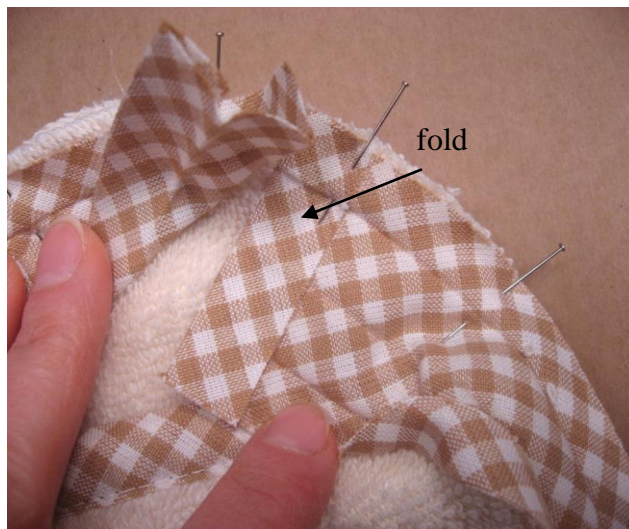
Attach the Pocket:

Place the pocket on top of the back piece and pin together. Unfold the bias trim and pin in place around the perimeter of the bath mitt.



Fold and iron down one end of the bias trim. The other end will be placed inside of the folded one. Sew in the crease around the perimeter of the trim.

The placement of the join should be made near the top of the bath mitt where there are not as many layers of fabric to sew through.



Before sewing the trim down on the other side, trim the excess terry cloth to remove bulk.



Fold the bias trim up and over the raw edge of the fabric and under again. Place the raw end of the trim into the folded end. Pin trim in place. Sew around the perimeter, closely to the edge.♦
